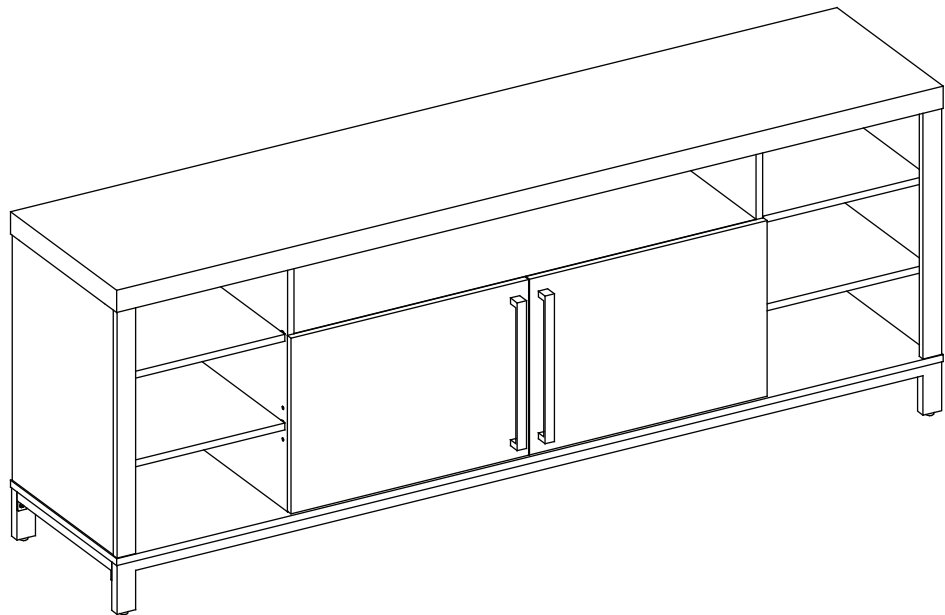

(61.24 kg) and having a width that permits it to sit evenly on the TV stand with no more than a one-inch overhang on each side of the panel. Use with products that weigh more than the maximum weight allowed, or with dimensions that extend beyond the maximum width may result in instability, which may result in injury.

Installation tips

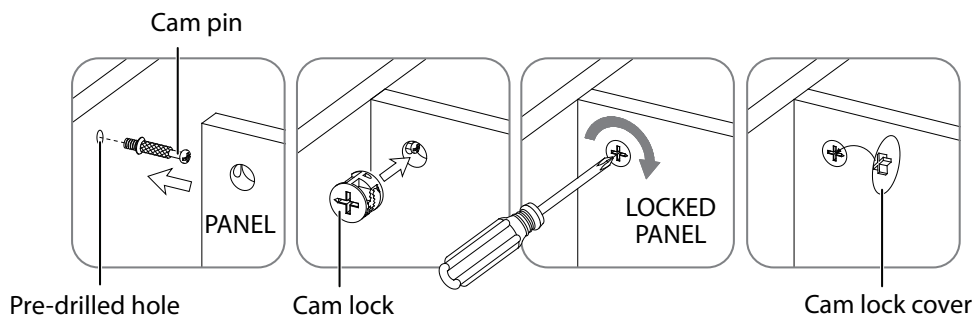
Gluing wood dowels (T)

When using a wood dowel (T), put one drop of glue (LL) in the hole before you insert the wood dowel (T). Insert the wood dowel (T), then gently tap it with a rubber mallet to secure it in place.



Locking cam pins (U) and cam locks (V)

- 1 One end of a cam pin (U) is threaded so that it screws into place. The other end is not threaded. Before you insert the non-threaded end into a hole, insert a cam lock (V) into the hole and make sure that the hole in the cam lock (V) faces the outside edge of the part being used.
- 2 Insert the non-threaded end of the cam pin (U) through the hole in the part being used and into the cam lock hole, then rotate the cam lock (V) clockwise with a screwdriver to lock the cam pin (U) into place.
- 3 Insert a cam lock cover (Z) into the cross slot of the cam lock (V) to conceal.



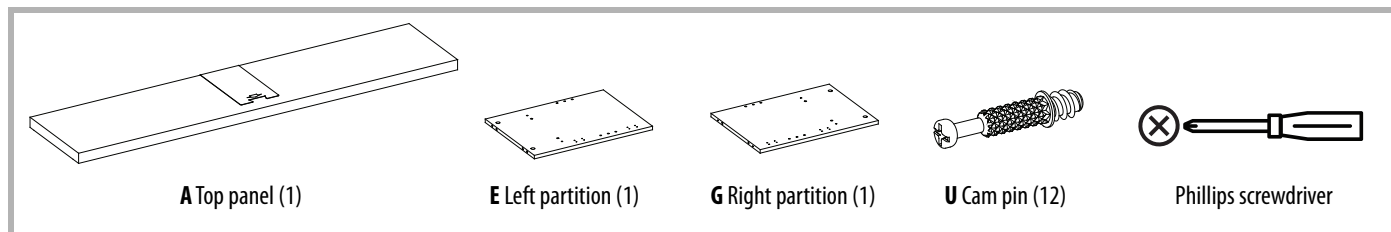
Assembling your TV stand

Tip: Assemble your TV stand on a carpeted floor or the empty TV stand carton to avoid scratching it.

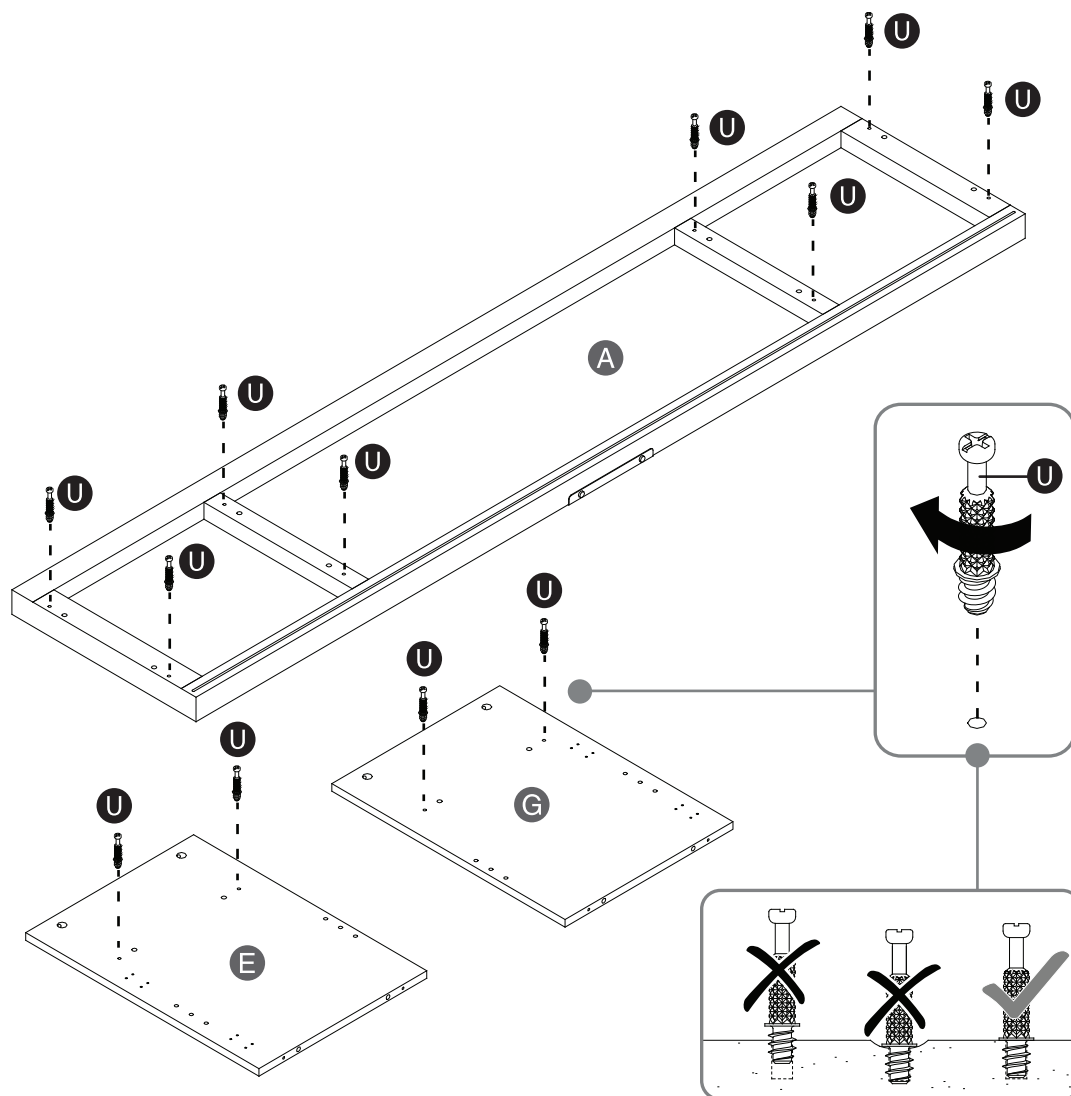
Note: Do not fully tighten all bolts until you finish assembling all of the parts. After assembly, go back and fully tighten all bolts. This will make the assembly easier.

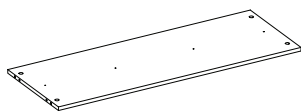
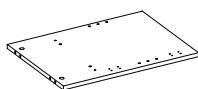
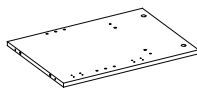
STEP 1: Preparing the top panel and partitions

You need:

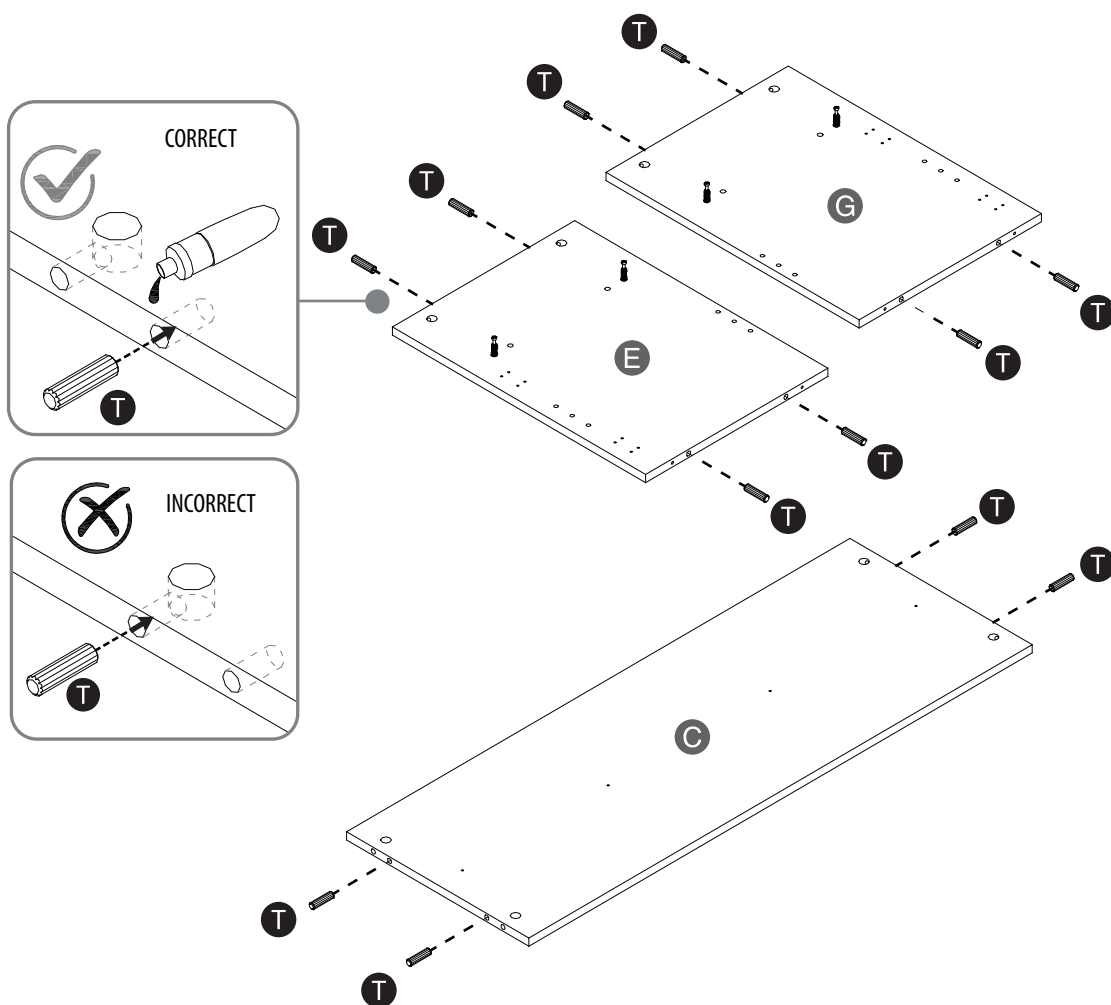


- Securely screw the cam pins (U) into the indicated holes in the top panel (A) and partitions (E and G), using a Phillips screwdriver.



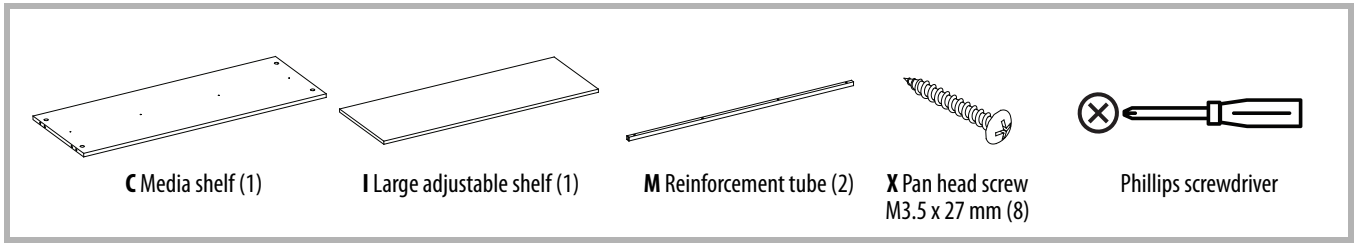
STEP 2: Preparing the media shelf and partitions**You need:****C** Media shelf (1)**E** Left partition (1)**G** Right partition (1)**T** Wood dowel (12)**LL** Glue (1)

- Glue wood dowels (**T**) into the pre-drilled inner holes on the shelf (**C**) and partitions (**E** and **G**).

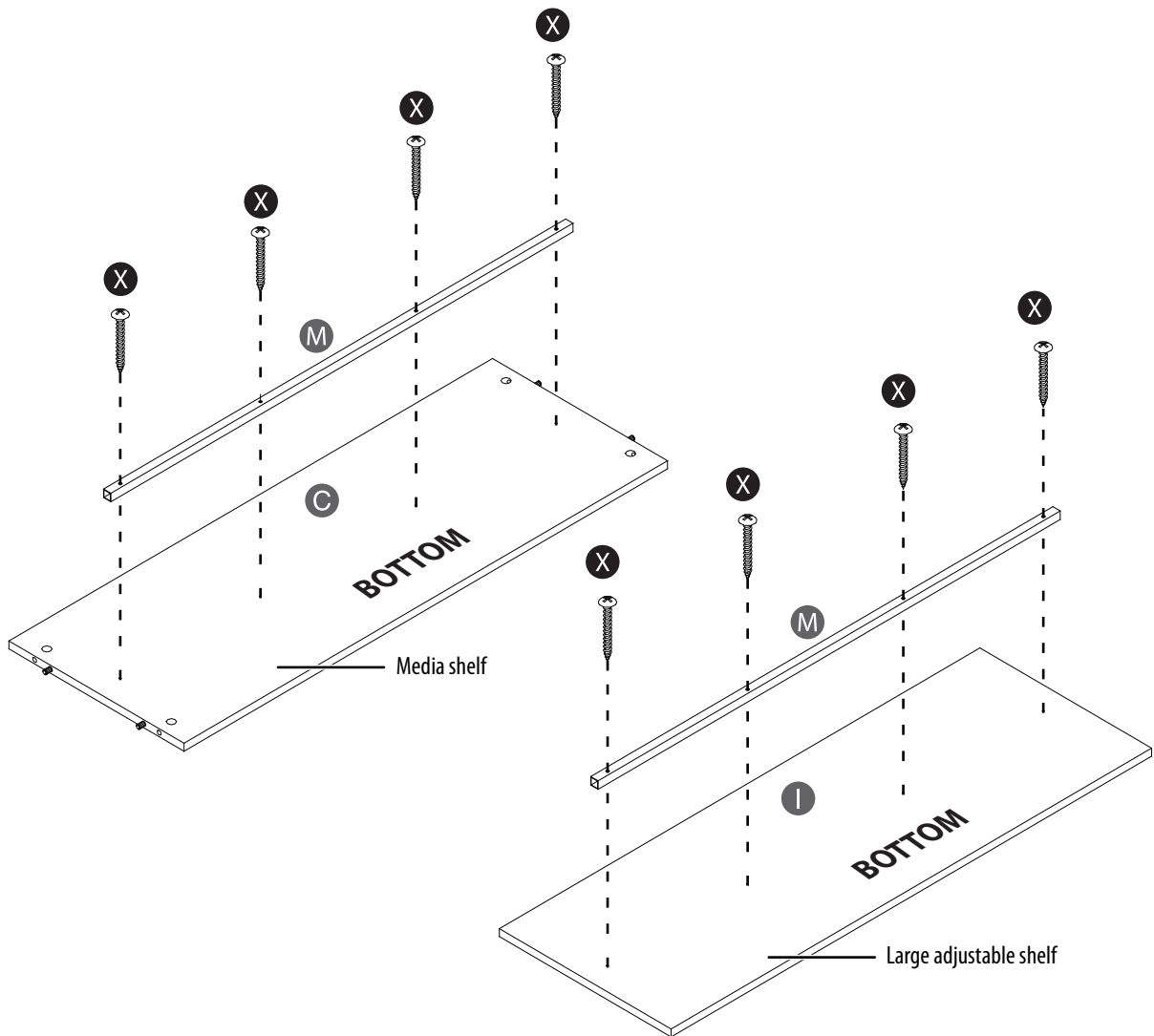


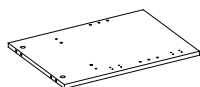
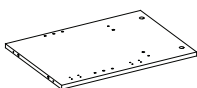
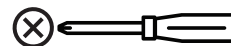
STEP 3: Installing the reinforcement tubes onto the shelves

You need:



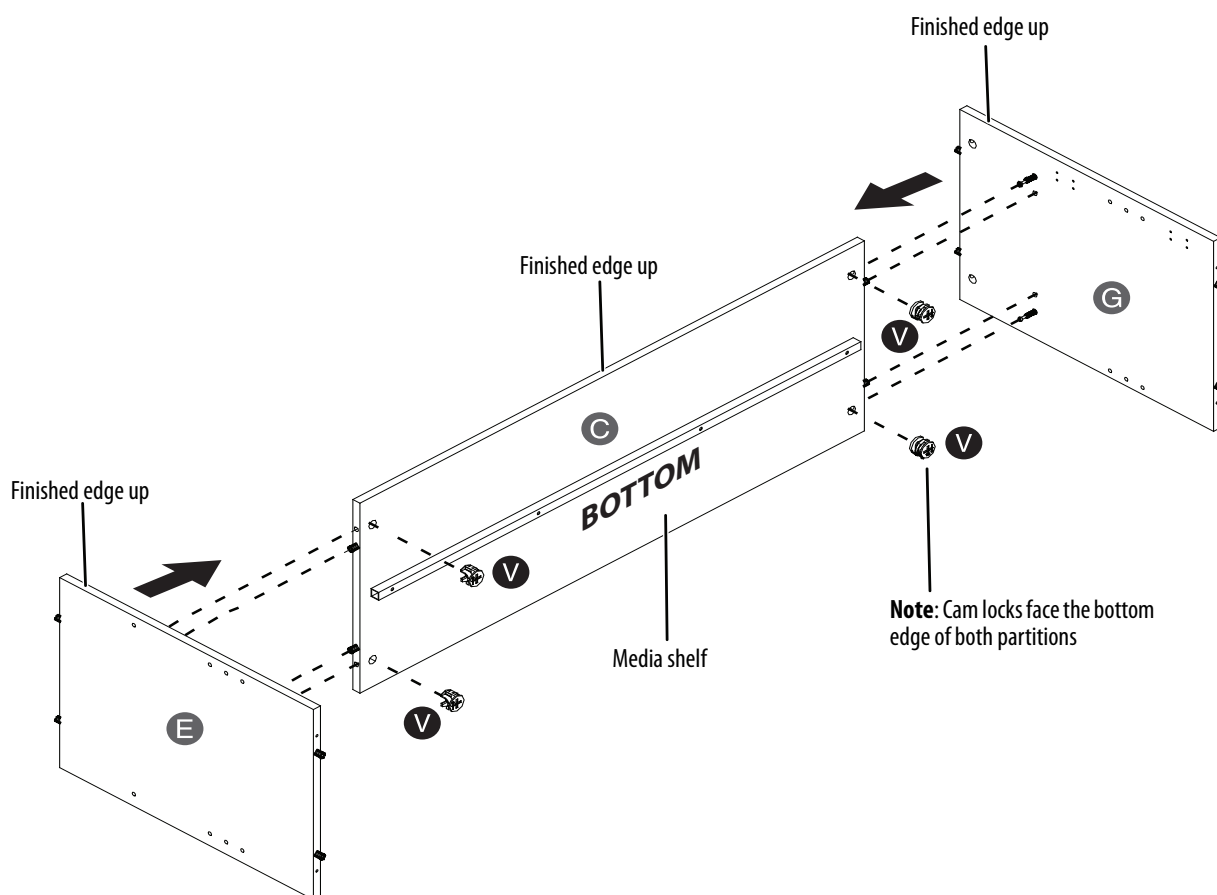
- Using the pilot holes as a guide, fasten one reinforcement tube (**M**) to the bottom of each shelf (**C** and **I**) with four M3.5 x 27 mm pan head screws (**X**). Tighten with a Phillips screwdriver.



STEP 4: Installing the media shelf between the partitions**You need:****E** Left partition (1)**G** Right partition (1)**V** Cam lock (4)

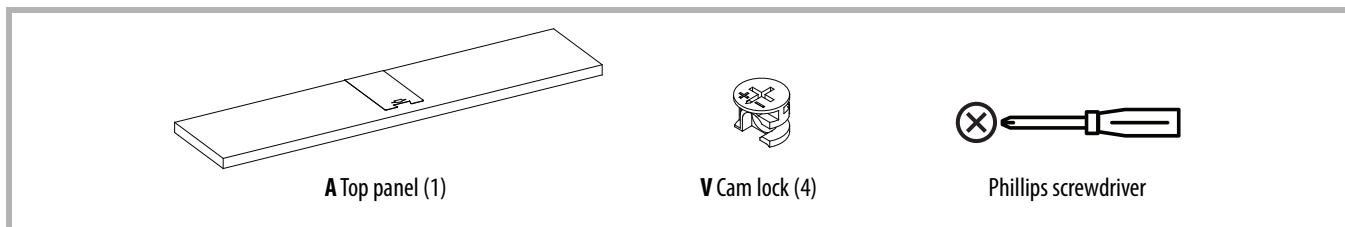

- Align and attach the media shelf (**C**) between both partitions (**E** and **G**) by engaging and tightening four cam locks (**V**).

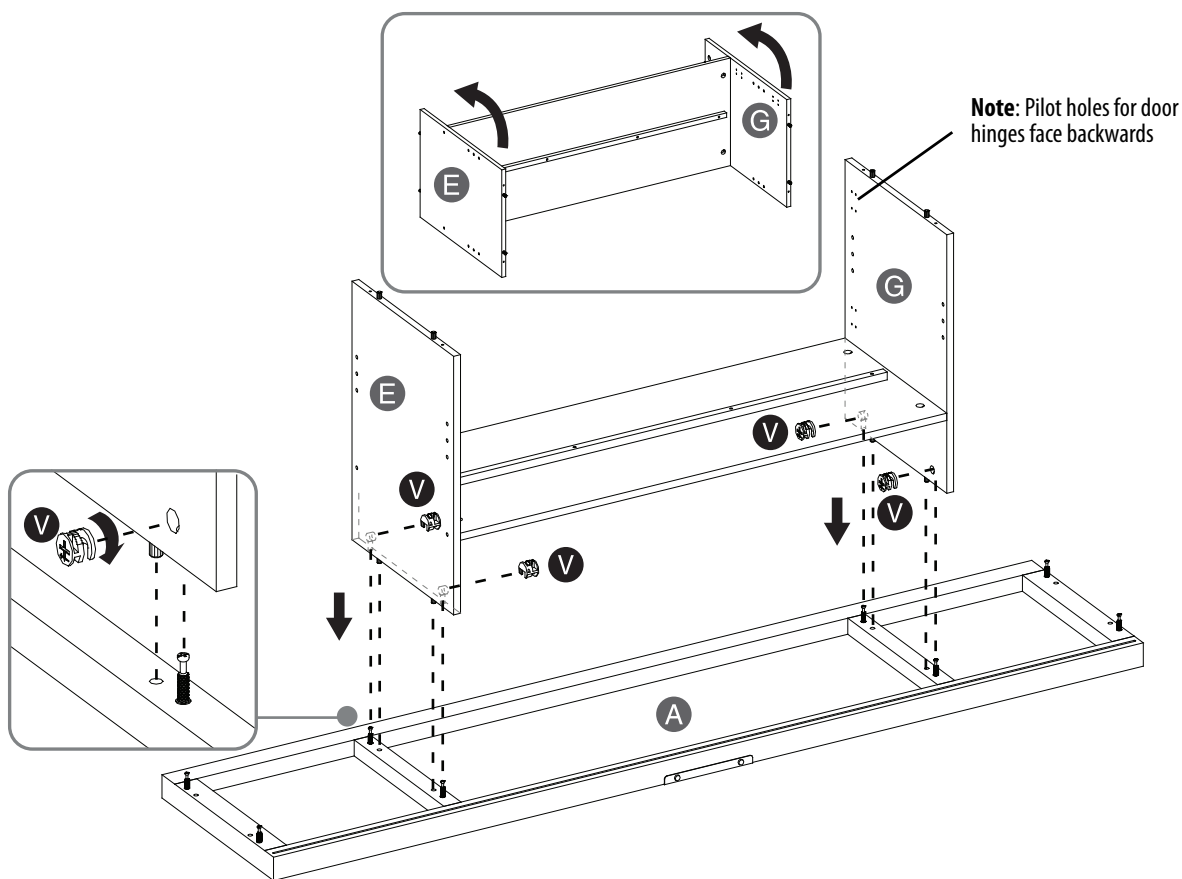


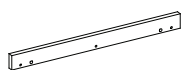
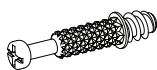
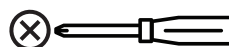
STEP 5: Attaching the assembled partitions to the top panel

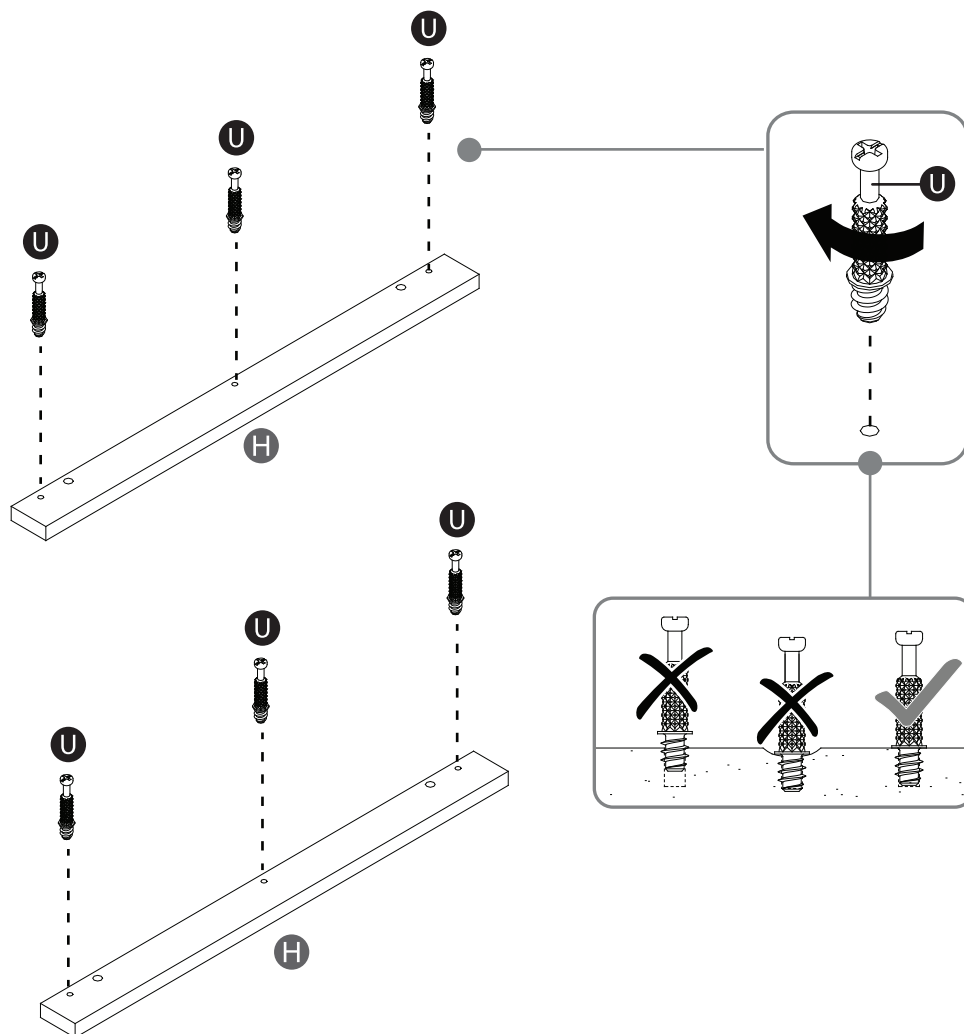
- Align and attach the assembled partitions (**E** and **G**) to the top panel (**A**) by engaging and tightening four cam locks (**V**) with a Phillips screwdriver.



STEP 6: Preparing the front moldings**You need:****H** Front molding (2)**U** Cam pin (6)

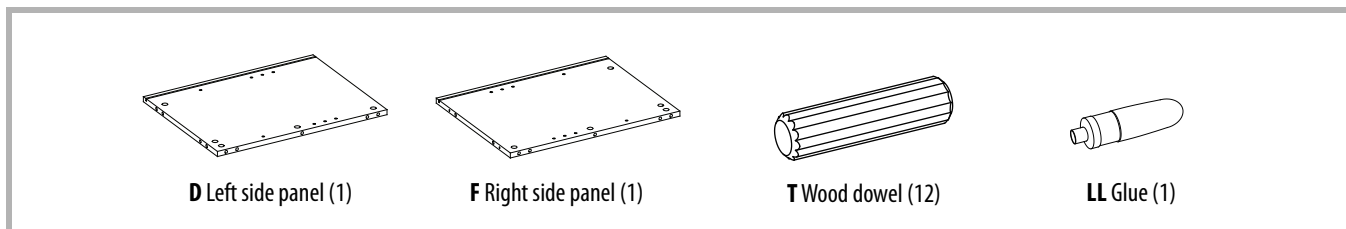

- Securely screw the cam pins (**U**) into the indicated holes in the front moldings (**H**), using a Phillips screwdriver.

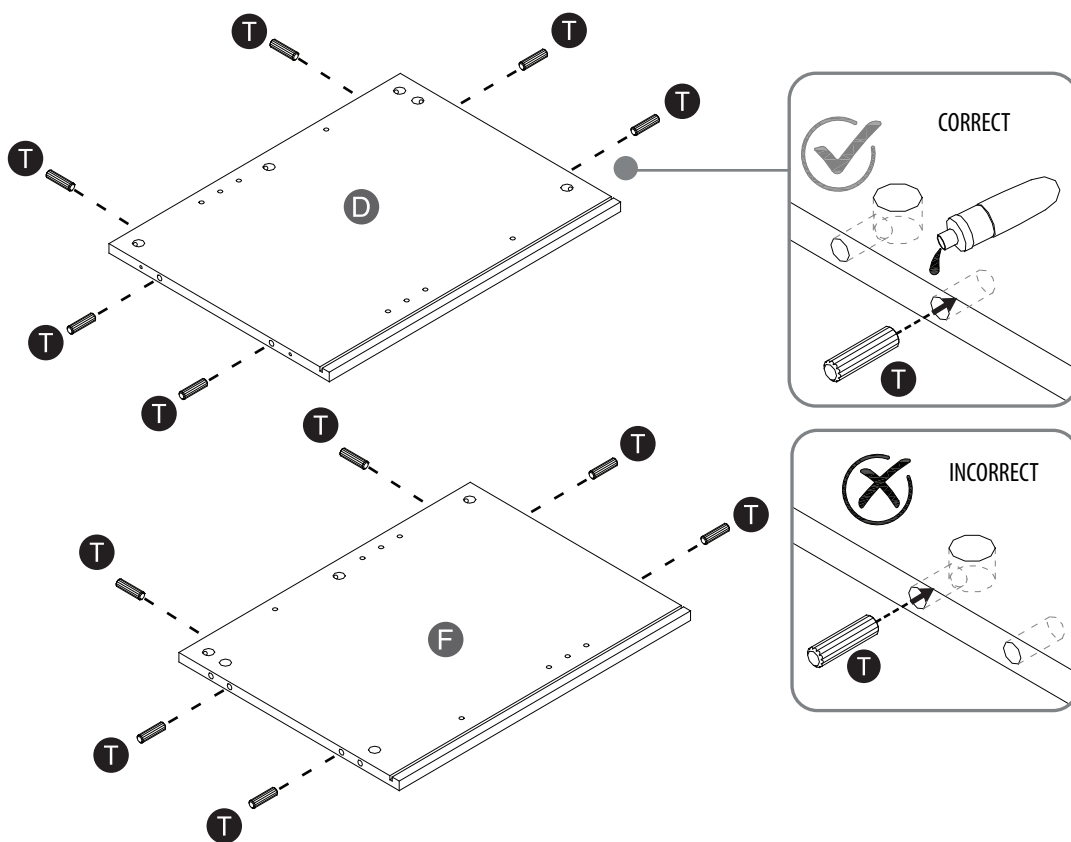


STEP 7: Preparing the side panels

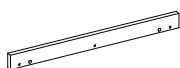


- Glue wood dowels (**T**) into the inner holes pre-drilled in the ends of both side panels (**D** and **F**).

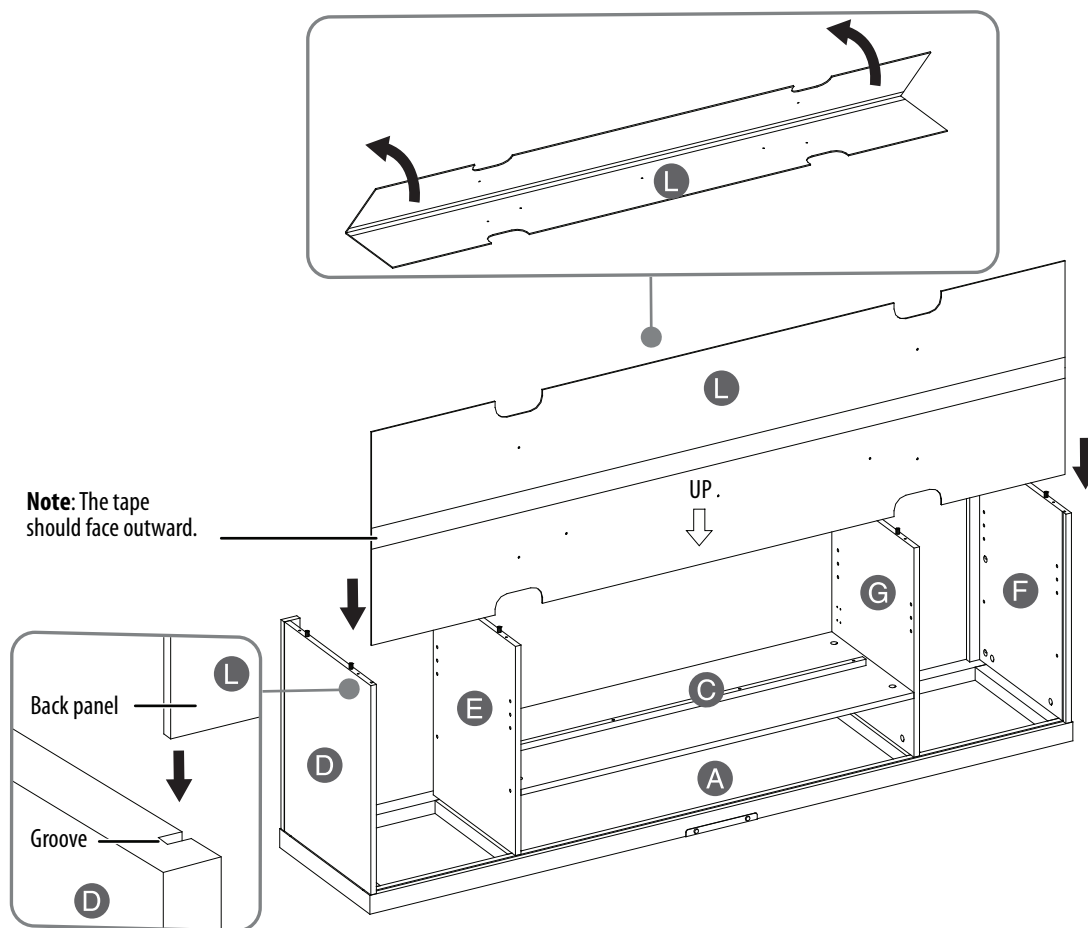
- Align and attach the assembled side panels (**D** and **F**) to the top panel (**A**) by engaging and tightening four cam locks (**V**).

Note: The molding faces the front of the unit.



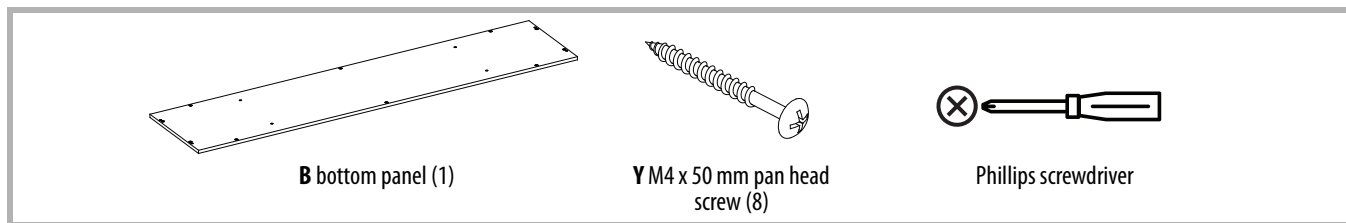
STEP 10: Installing the back panel**You need:****L** Back panel (1)

- Unfold the back panel (**L**) and slide it into the grooves on both side panels (**D** and **F**) until it's fully inserted into the top panel (**A**). Make sure that the three pilot holes on the back panel (**L**) line up with the media shelf (**C**).

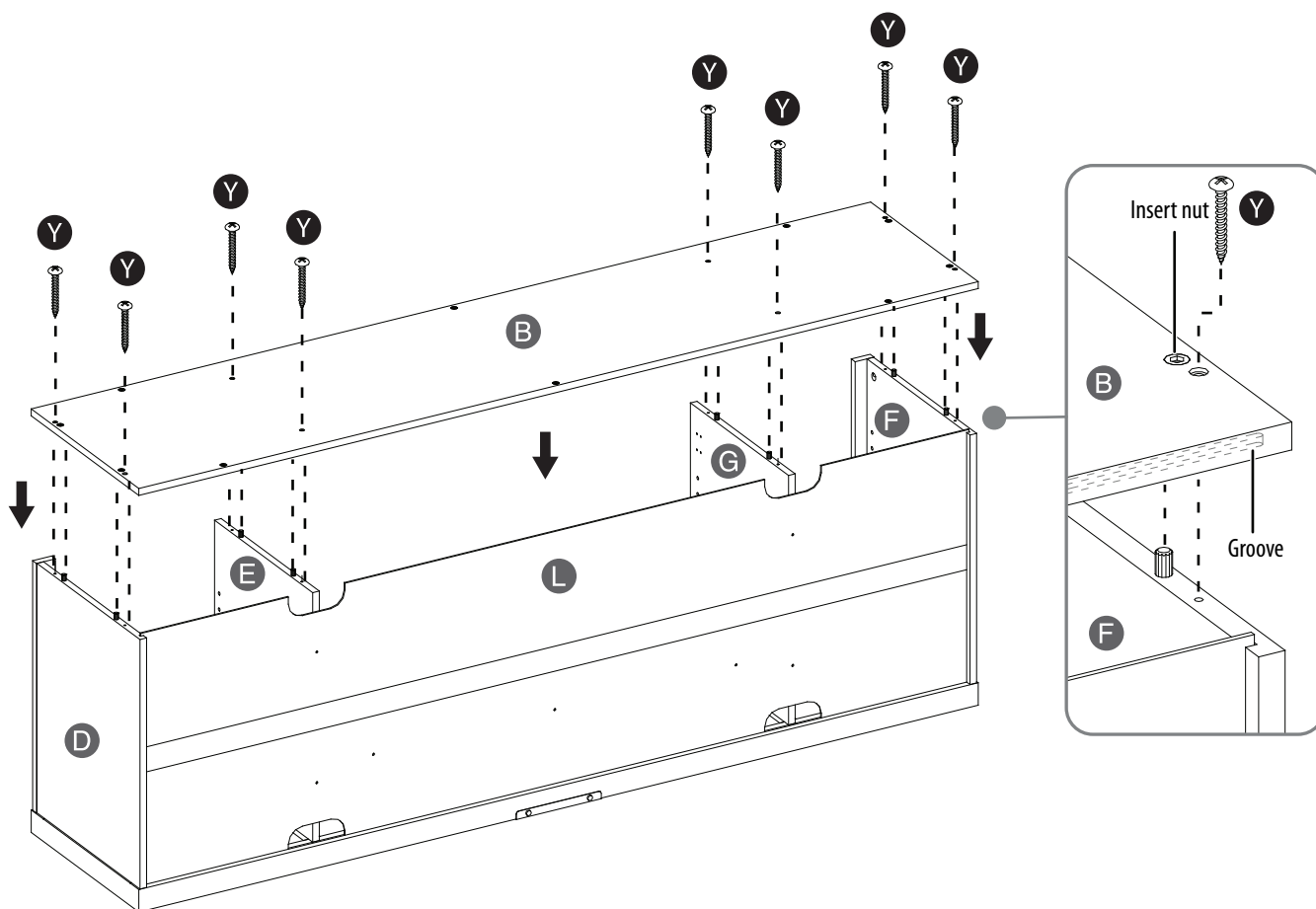


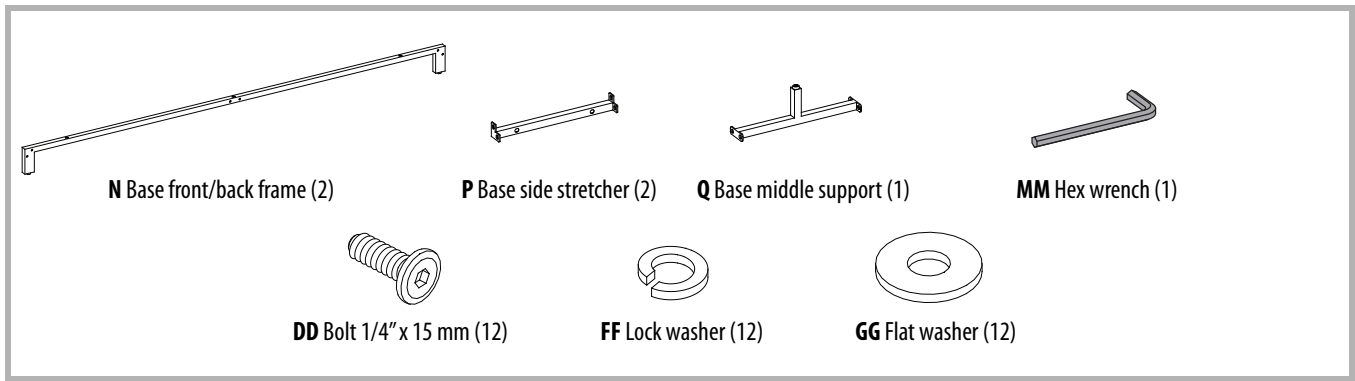
STEP 11: Installing the bottom panel on the unit

You need:

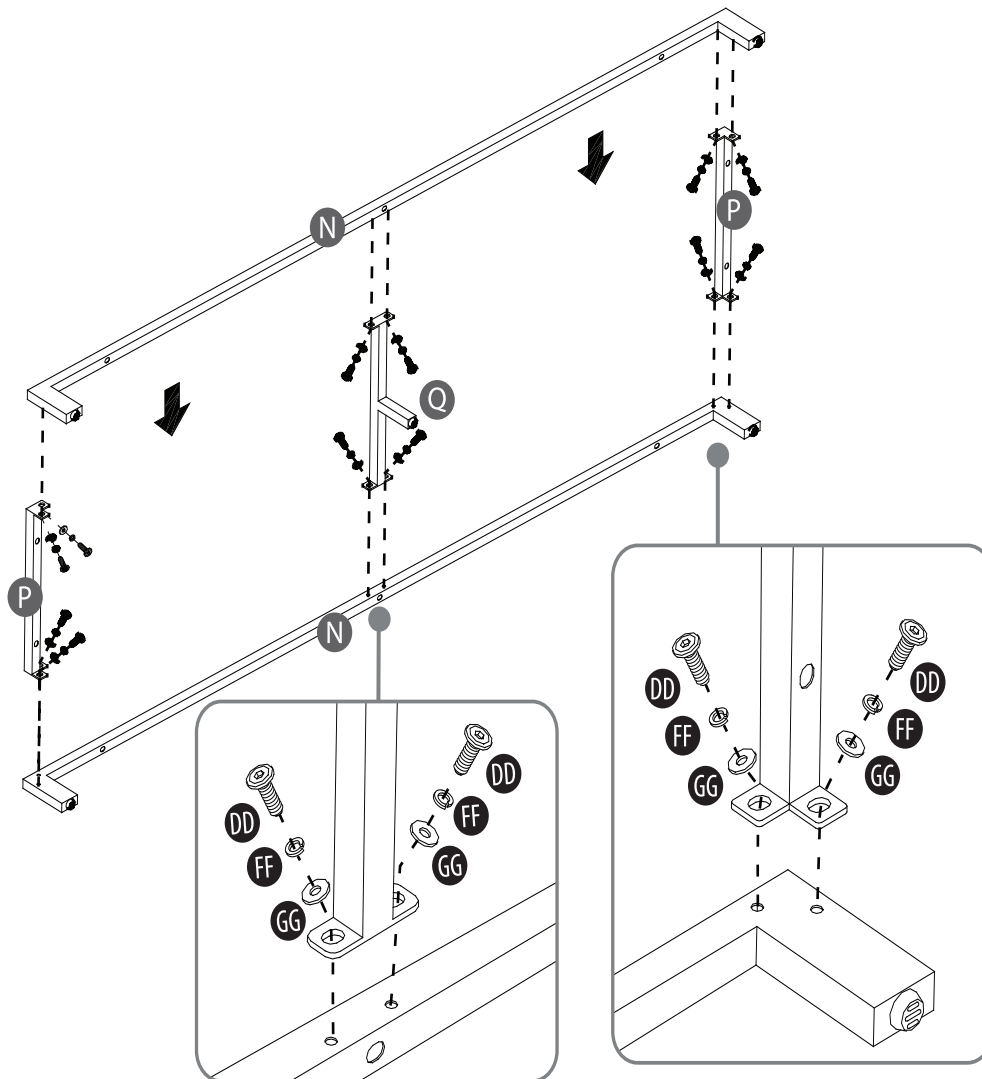


- Align and attach the bottom panel (**B**) to the assembled vertical partitions and panels (**D**, **E**, **F**, and **G**) with eight M4 x 50 mm pan head screws (**Y**). Make sure that back panel (**L**) fits securely into the groove in the bottom panel (**B**).



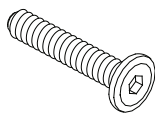
STEP 12: Assembling the metal base**You need:**

- 1 Align and attach two base side stretchers (**P**) to one base front/back frame (**N**) by inserting four 1/4" x 15 mm bolts (**DD**) with lock washers (**FF**) and flat washers (**GG**) through the metal brackets and loosely screw into place.
- 2 Align and attach the base middle support (**Q**) to the base front/back frame (**N**) with two 1/4" x 15 mm bolts (**DD**) with lock washers (**FF**) and flat washers (**GG**). DO NOT fully tighten the bolts.
- 3 Repeat the same process to attach the other base front/back frame (**N**) at the opposite end.



STEP 13: Attaching the metal base to the bottom panel

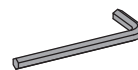

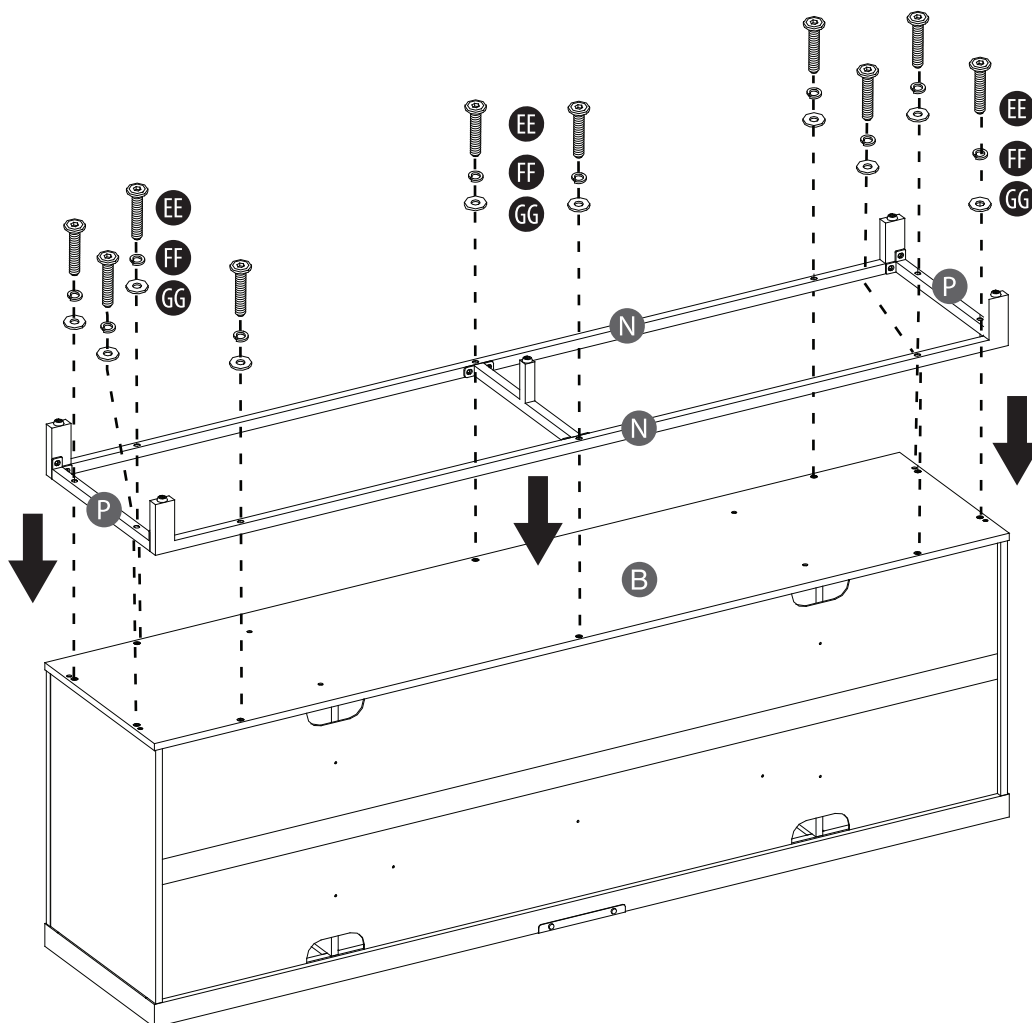


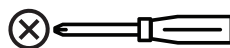

- Align and attach the assembled base to the bottom panel (**B**) of the unit with ten 1/4" x 32 mm bolts (**EE**), ten lock washers (**FF**), and ten flat washers (**GG**). After tightening the bolts holding the base to the bottom panel (**B**), fully tighten the bolts installed during the previous assembly step (on page 19).

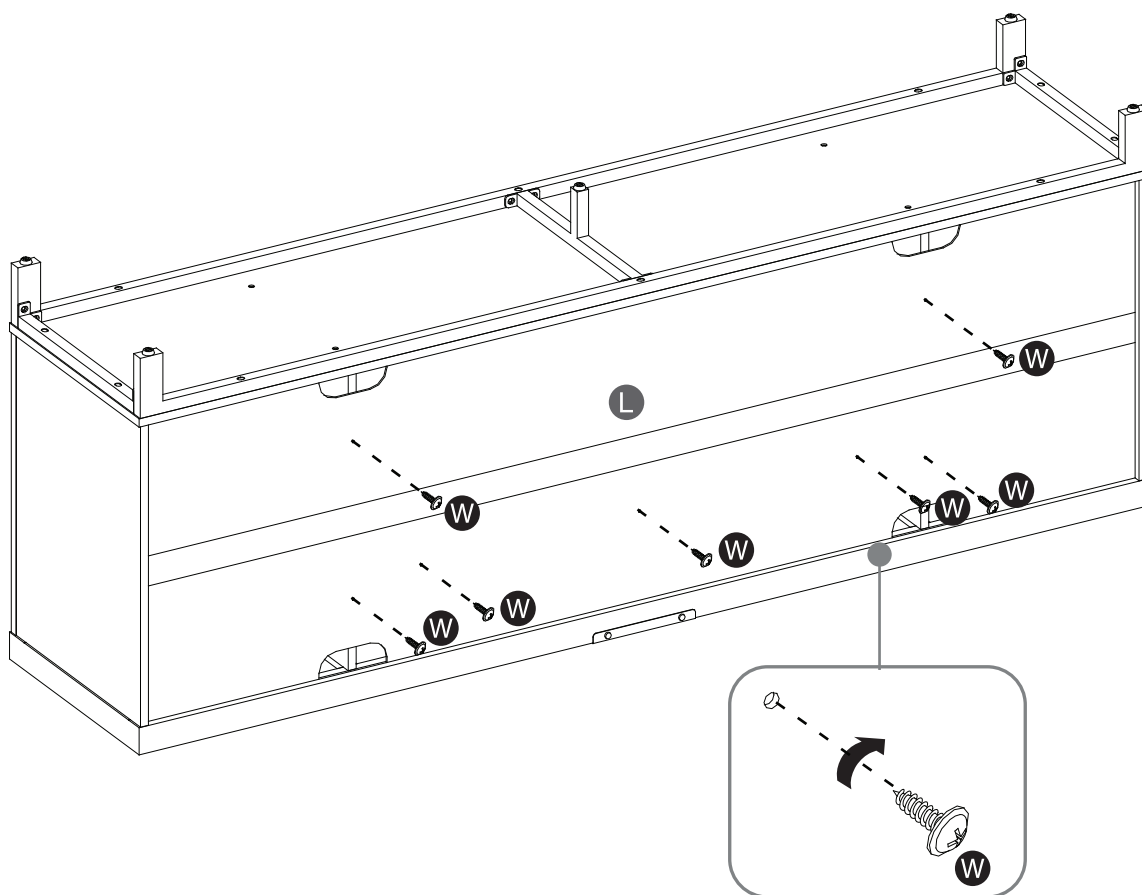


STEP 14: Fastening the back panel to the media shelf and partitions**You need:****W** M3.5 x 15 mm washer head screw (7)

Phillips screwdriver

- Insert seven M3.5 x 15 mm washer head screws (**W**) through the mounting holes in the back panel (**L**) and into the media shelf (**C**) and partition panels (**E** and **G**), using a Phillips screwdriver.

CAUTION: Always exercise caution to ensure that you do not damage the edges of the partitions or the media shelf.



STEP 15: Fastening the back panel to the assembled unit

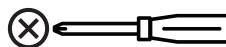

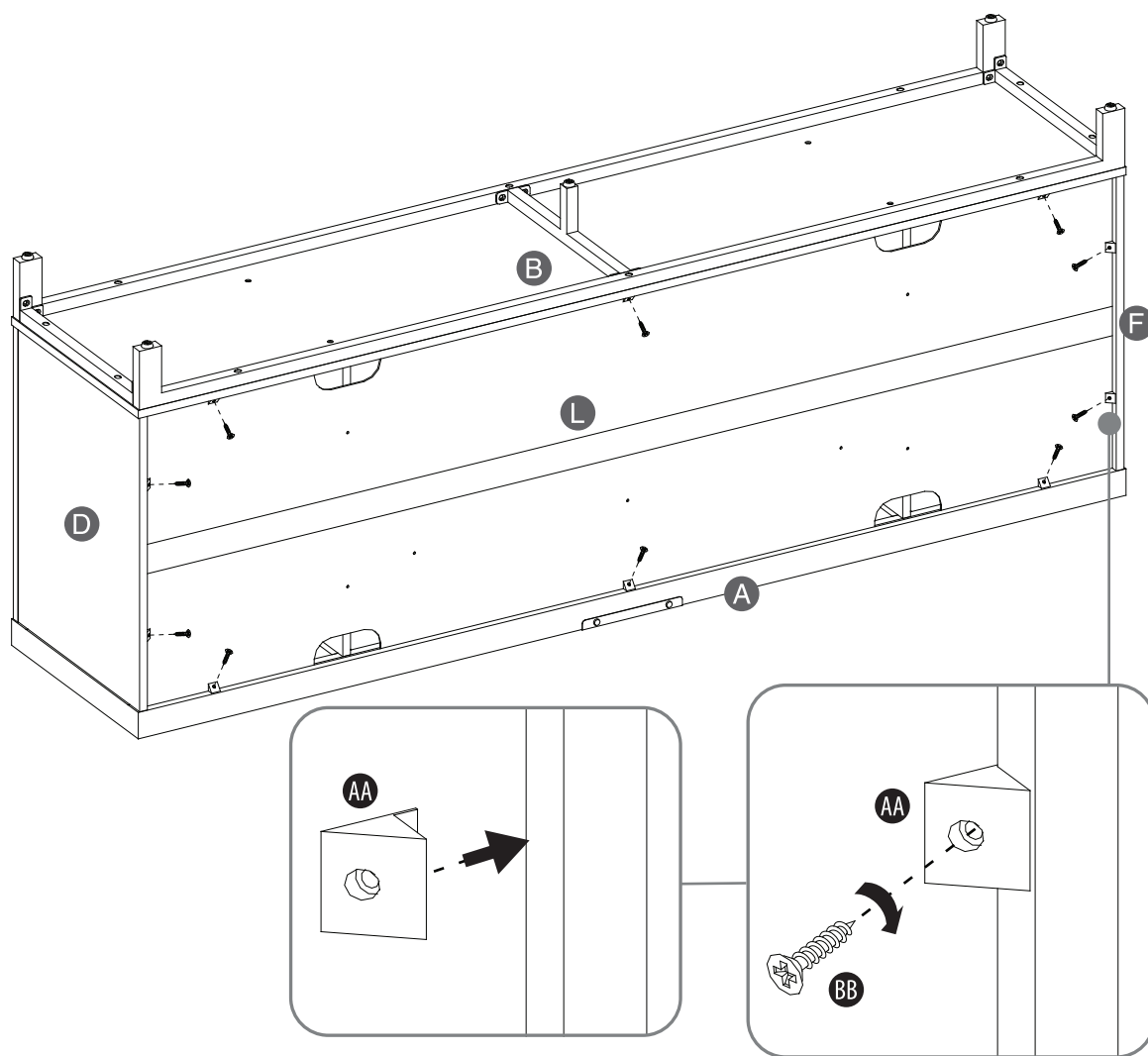

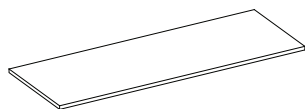
- 1 Insert ten plastic holders (**AA**) evenly into the gaps between the back panel (**L**) and the other panels (**A**, **B**, **D**, and **F**) as shown.
- 2 Secure the plastic holders into place with ten M3 x 17 mm screws (**BB**), using a Phillips screwdriver. Do not damage the edges.



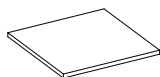
STEP 16: Installing the adjustable shelves (optional)

Note: The included four small adjustable shelves (J) are optional. To accommodate a vertical gaming console, you can choose not to install one or more of the shelves.

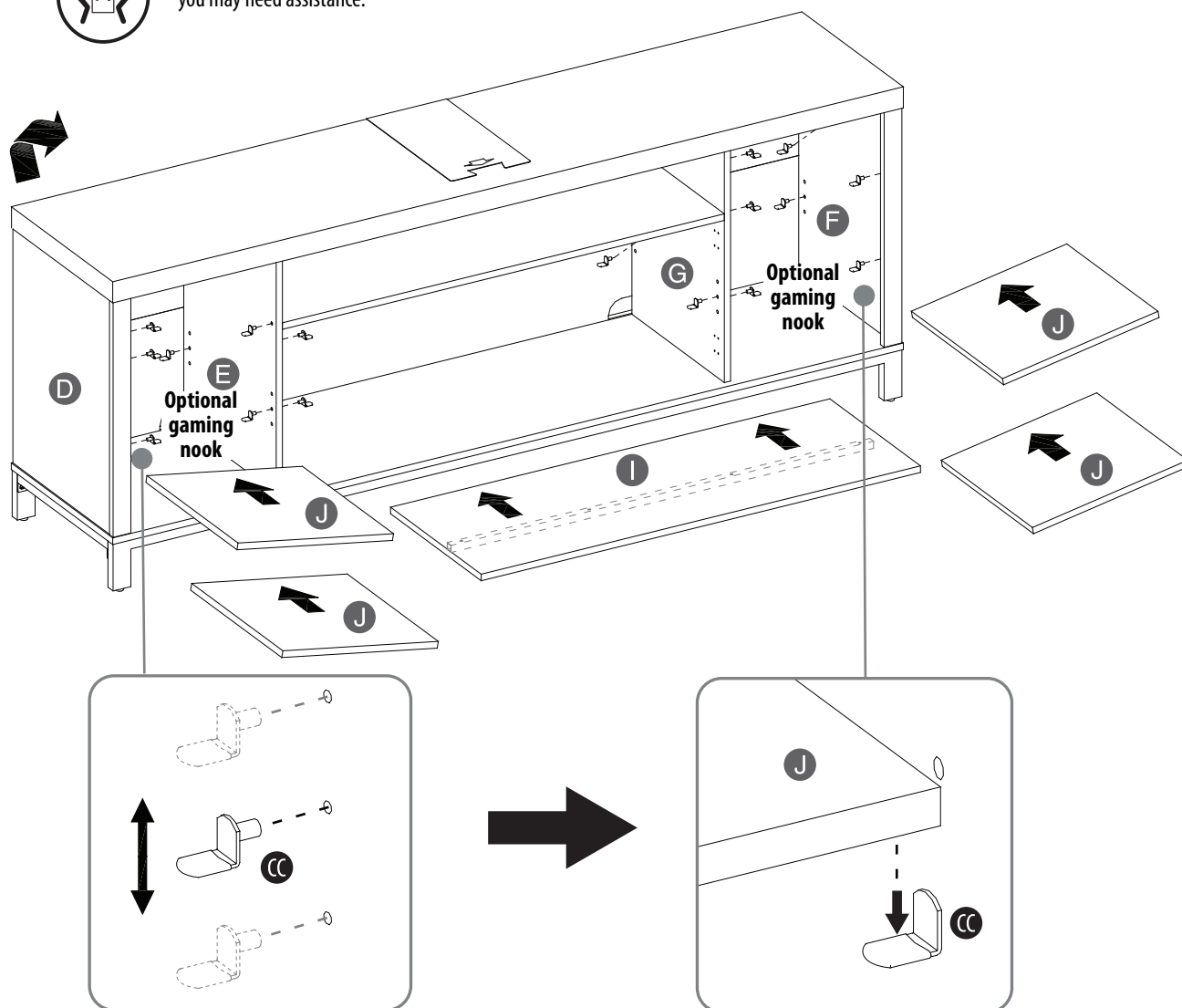


CC Shelf support (20)

- 1 Lift the unit upright and position it near the desired location. The unit is heavy so you may need to ask for assistance.
- 2 Insert the shelf supports (CC) into the holes at the desired height. Make sure that you place the four shelf supports at the same level to assure a level shelf.
- 3 Insert and rest the adjustable shelves (I and J) onto the shelf supports (CC).

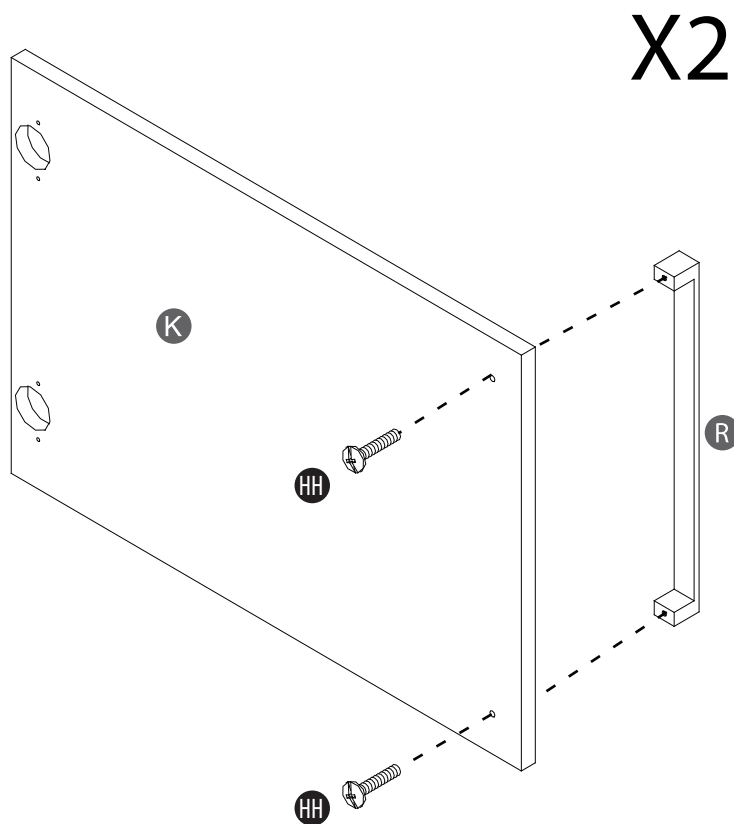
- 1 Using the pilot holes as a guide, align and attach one hinge base (**S**) onto the left partition (**E**). Insert two M3.5 x 15 mm flat head screws (**II**) through the center of the oval holes and move the hinge arm to the position you want, then fasten the hinge (**S**) into place with the Phillips screwdriver. DO NOT fully tighten the screws.
- 2 Insert two M3.5 x 15 mm flat head screws (**II**) through the round holes on the hinge base (**S**) and fasten into place with the Phillips screwdriver.
- 3 Repeat the same process to install the other three hinges.



STEP 18: Installing the door handles**You need:****K** Door (2)**R** Handle (2)**HH** 22 mm Handle bolt (4)

Phillips screwdriver

- Attach one handle (**R**) to the front side of each door (**K**) with two 22 mm handle bolts (**HH**). Tighten with a Phillips screwdriver.

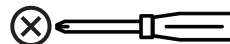

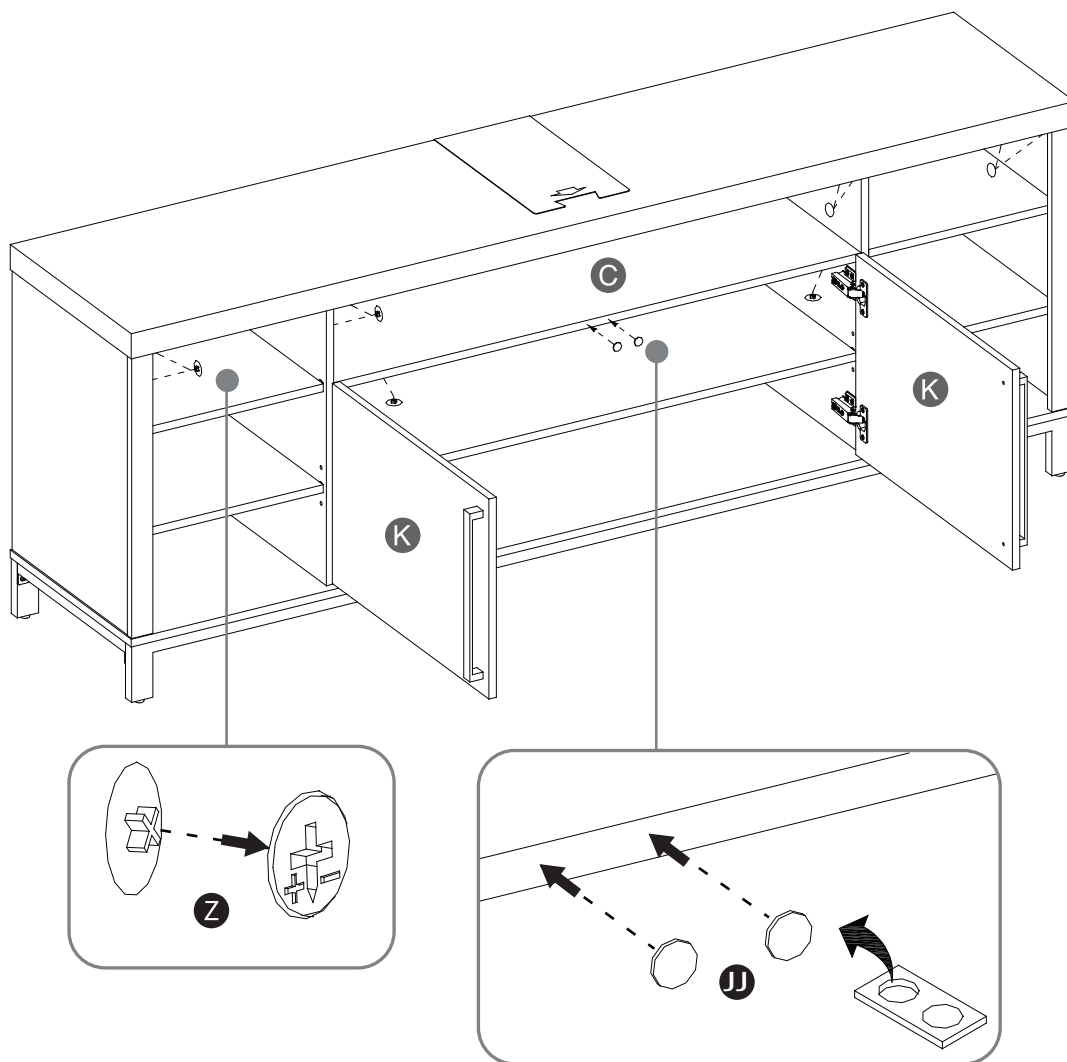
Phillips screwdriver

- 1 Pick up one door (**K**) and fit it to the cups on the hinge arm (**S**) installed on the left partition (**E**). Use a Phillips screwdriver to fasten the two hinge cups to the door (**K**) with four M3.5 x 15 mm flat head screws (**II**).
- 2 Repeat the same process to attach the other door (**K**) to the right partition (**G**).
- 3 Open and close the doors to make sure they are aligned and shut correctly. If necessary, adjust the screws for a good fit. Fully tighten all the M3.5 x 15 mm flat head screws (**II**) when they are aligned properly.



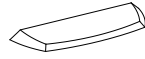
STEP 20: Installing the cam lock covers and rubber door bumpers**You need:****Z** Cam lock covers (18)**JJ** Rubber door bumper (2)

- 1 Plug the cam lock covers (**Z**) onto the visible cam locks, to conceal the cams.
- 2 Affix two rubber bumpers (**JJ**) on the front edge of the media shelf (**C**) where the doors (**K**) make contact.



STEP 21: Attaching the stopper to the top panel

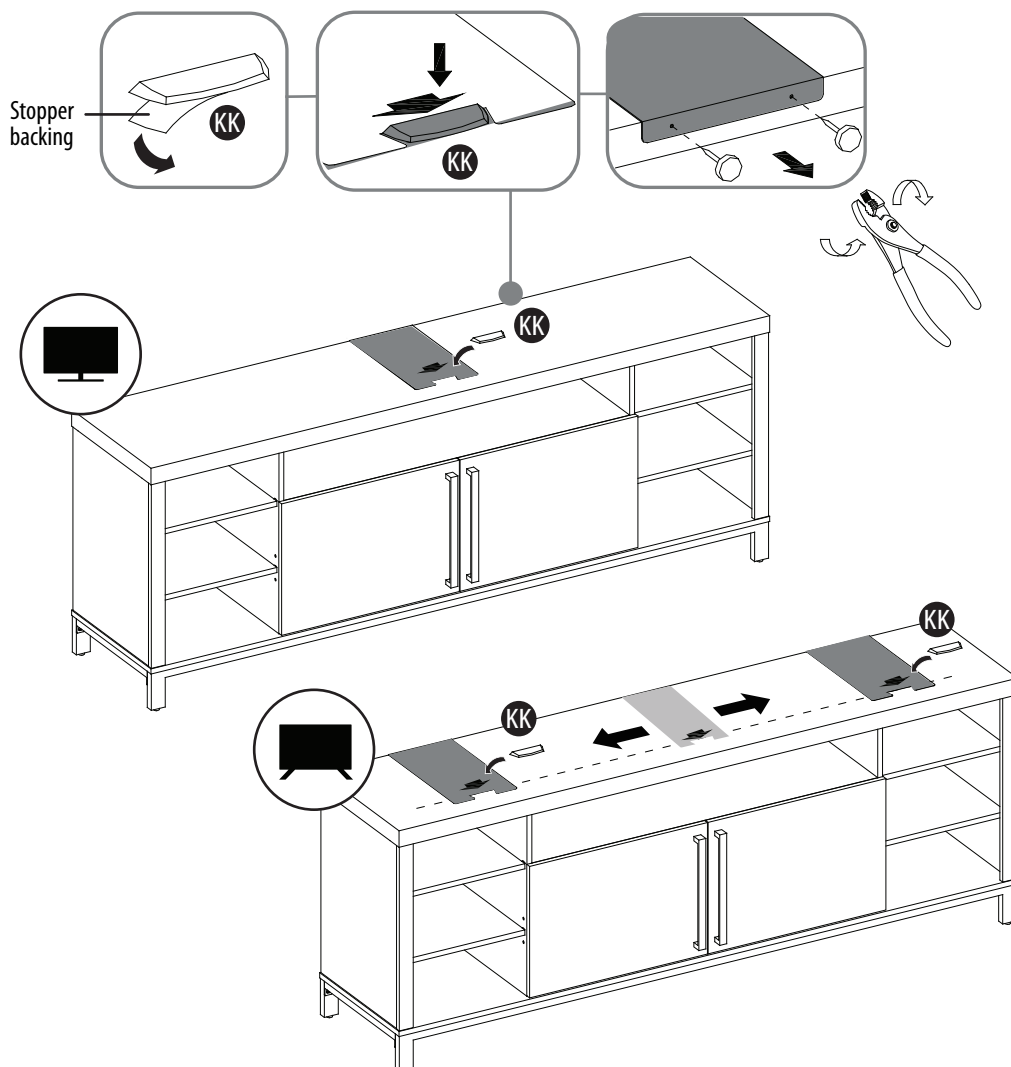
If you place your TV on top of your TV stand, you must follow these instructions to prevent your TV from tipping. Otherwise, skip to [STEP 22: Positioning the TV stand and installing the tipping restraints on page 29](#).

If your TV has one leg

- 1 Remove the paper backing from the bottom of the stopper (KK), then place it in the stopper cut-out of the template on the top panel (A). Press down on the stopper (KK) to adhere it to the panel.
- 2 On the back of the top panel (A), carefully pull out the thumb tacks to remove the stopper template.

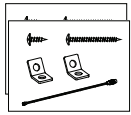
If your TV has two legs:

- 1 On the back of the top panel (A), carefully pull out the thumb tacks to remove the stopper template.
- 2 Align the template at the position where one of your TV's legs or one of the feet will be located.
- 3 Remove the paper backing from the stopper (KK), then place it in the stopper cut-out of the template on the top panel (A). Press down on the stopper (KK) to adhere it to the panel.
- 4 Repeat this process to attach the second stopper where the other one of the TV's legs or feet will be located.

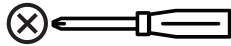

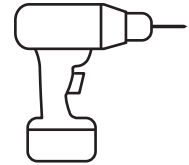

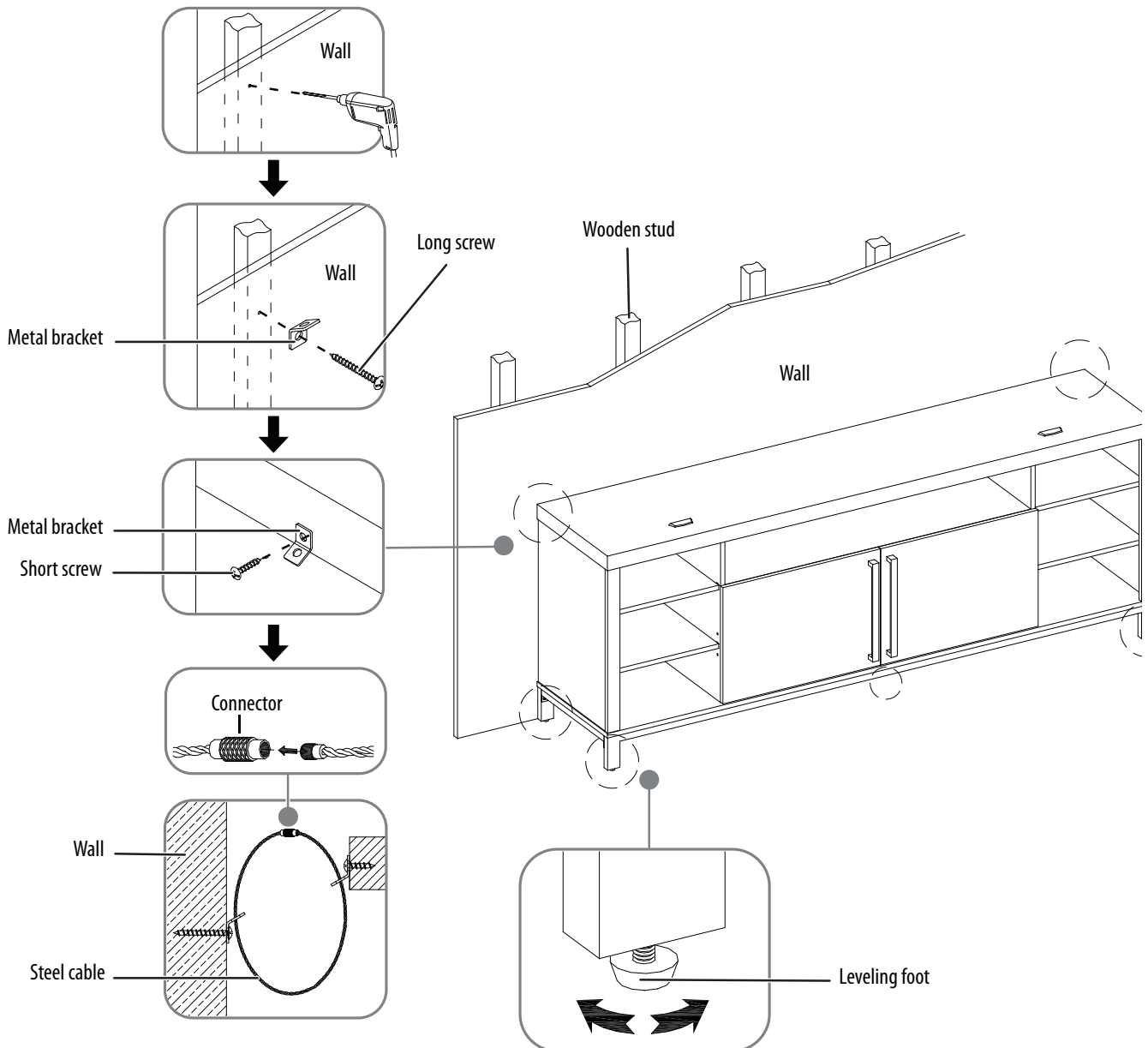

- 1 Position the assembled TV stand against the wall where you plan to use it.
- 2 Adjust the leveling feet to level the TV stand.
- 3 Follow the instructions printed on the bag containing the tipping restraint hardware kit (PP) to attach the restraint hardware to the wall and to the TV stand.

WARNING: It is very important that the tipping restraint be installed correctly. Failure to do this could result in your TV stand falling forward, resulting in damage to equipment or personal injury.



Maintaining your TV stand

Wood/Laminate

- Use your favorite type of furniture polish.
- Do not spray polish directly onto the TV stand. Spray onto a soft cloth, then wipe the TV stand.
- Always test any polish in a discrete location first, such as the back of the TV stand, to make sure that there is no adverse reaction.
- Dust frequently with a soft cloth.
- Never slide objects across surfaces. Lift objects from the top surface rather than dragging them across the finish when moving them.
- Do not expose your TV stand to direct sunlight, drying heat sources, or dampness.
- Clean spills immediately with a soft, damp cloth.
- Use a protective pad when using your TV stand as a writing surface (especially when using a ballpoint pen).

Metal

- For everyday cleaning of chrome, brass, aluminum, and painted metal surfaces, wipe with a slightly damp, soft cotton cloth, or vacuum to keep them looking their best.
- If soiled, wipe with clean sponge or cloth wrung out of water. Wipe dry with a cloth or paper towel to avoid water spots.
- Don't use any harsh abrasives or chemicals to clean any metal surfaces because they may damage the protective coating.
- Metal may rust if the finish is scratched or if your furniture is exposed to excessive humidity, particularly in salt water locations.
- Most metal furniture has a protective coating to prevent rust, however rust may occur if the finish is marred or wears away over time.

ONE-YEAR LIMITED WARRANTY

Definitions:

The Distributor* of Insignia branded products warrants to you, the original purchaser of this new Insignia-branded product ("Product"), that the Product shall be free of defects in the original manufacture of the material or workmanship for a period of one (1) year from the date of your purchase of the Product ("Warranty Period").

For this warranty to apply, your Product must be purchased in the United States or Canada from a Best Buy branded retail store or online at www.bestbuy.com or www.bestbuy.ca and is packaged with this warranty statement.

How long does the coverage last?

The Warranty Period lasts for 1 year (365 days) from the date you purchased the Product. Your purchase date is printed on the receipt you received with the Product.

What does this warranty cover?

During the Warranty Period, if the original manufacture of the material or workmanship of the Product is determined to be defective by an authorized Insignia repair center or store personnel, Insignia will (at its sole option): (1) repair the Product with new or rebuilt parts; or (2) replace the Product at no charge with new or rebuilt comparable products or parts. Products and parts replaced under this warranty become the property of Insignia and are not returned to you. If service of Products or parts are required after the Warranty Period expires, you must pay all labor and parts charges. This warranty lasts as long as you own your Insignia Product during the Warranty Period. Warranty coverage terminates if you sell or otherwise transfer the Product.

How to obtain warranty service?

If you purchased the Product at a Best Buy retail store location or from a Best Buy online website (www.bestbuy.com or www.bestbuy.ca), please take your original receipt and the Product to any Best Buy store. Make sure that you place the Product in its original packaging or packaging that provides the same amount of protection as the original packaging.

Where is the warranty valid?
