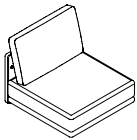
Unpacking the boxes

There are six unique box types

Depending on your configuration, you'll almost definitely have multiple boxes, and may not have all six different boxes. That's okay! For now, you should just group each box type together (Inline Seat boxes in one spot, Corner Seats over there, you get the picture).

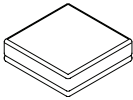
Each box contains the parts for a different core module, and from those core modules you can create any Field configuration. We'll unpack each box one at a time, and build each module separately. Once all of the modules are built, you'll connect them to configure your sofa or sectional.

Here's the most important thing right now: look at the index on page 8 to find the one-page map that matches the configuration you're setting up (check your order confirmation email if you don't remember the exact name) and keep it handy. It'll show you how many of each box you have. We recommend starting with the biggest box first (usually, a corner or one of the seats).



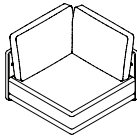

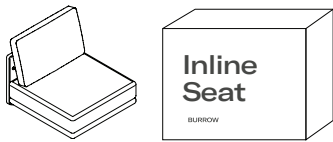


Part III

Building each module

Inline Seat

This box contains an Inline Seat module with a back panel. The back panel is the full width of the seat, and can be identified by the two alignment holes on the tabs (the arm panels have four holes).



Everything you need is included:

- 1x Platform
- 1x Seat cushion
- 1x Back panel
- 1x Back cushion cover
- 1x Back cushion insert
- 1x Straight brace
- 2x Hand screw
- 2x Slot screw

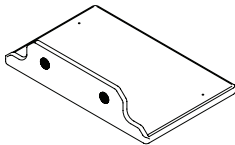


Tip: This box contains a straight brace and some slot screws, but you won't need them until you connect this module to another. Set them safely aside.

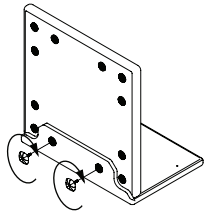
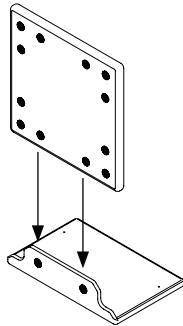
Inline Seat

There's only one position for an Inline Seat, so you don't need to worry about a left or right orientation. If you have one of these modules, there's only one set of instructions to follow.

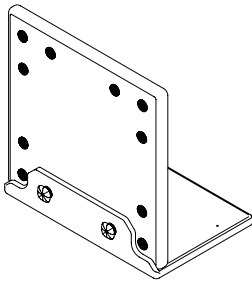
- 1 Lay the back panel flat on its back, so the tab is perpendicular to the floor.
- 2 Lower the platform so that it's nested inside the tab. Line up the left and right edges of the platform and the panel so that they're flush with each other.



- 3 Push a hand screw through each of the alignment holes, and loosely turn to catch the threaded insert. You may have to tilt the platform back and forth, or lift it up slightly, in order to get the hand screw to catch the thread. We recommend loosely attaching both hand screws to get the alignment right, rather than fully tightening one before the other.

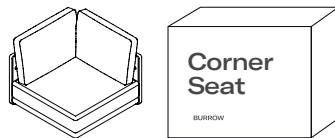


- 4 Put the partially-assembled Inline Seat module in its approximate final position, still lying on its back, and set aside any pieces you didn't use for later, when you connect this module to the others.














Corner Seat

This box contains an inner corner seat, with two back panels (the Corner End Seat modules have one back panel and one arm panel). It always sits between two other modules; it's never at the end of a sectional configuration.

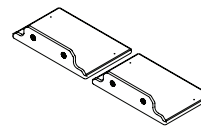


Tip: This box contains a straight brace and some extra slot screws, but you won't need them until you connect this module to another. Set them safely aside.

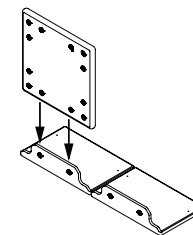
Corner Seat

There's only one position for a Corner Seat, so you don't need to worry about a left or right orientation. If you have one of these modules, there's only one set of instructions to follow.

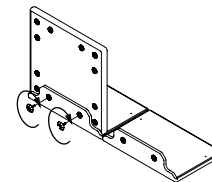
1 Lay both of the back panels flat on their backs, so the tabs are perpendicular to the floor.



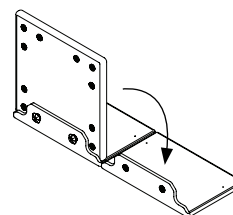
2 Lower the platform so that it's nested inside the tab of the left panel. Line up the left and right edges of the platform and the panel so that they're flush with each other.



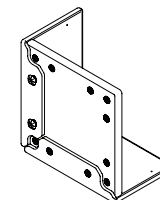
3 Push a hand screw through each of the alignment holes, and loosely turn to catch the threaded insert. You may have to tilt the platform back and forth, or lift it up slightly, in order to get the hand screw to catch the thread. We recommend loosely attaching both hand screws to get the alignment right, rather than fully tightening one before the other. Once you can feel that they've caught the thread, securely tighten both hand screws.



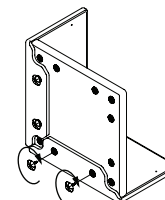
4 Make sure the second back panel is flush with the first one, and tilt the in-progress module so the platform is nested inside the tab of the second back panel.



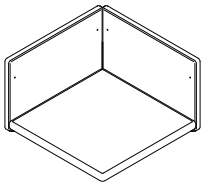
5 Line up the meeting edge of the two back panels so that they're flush. The alignment holes on the second back panel, on the floor, will line up with the threaded inserts on the platform.



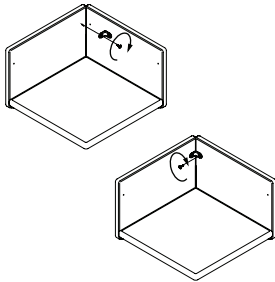
6 Just like you did in step 3, push a hand screw through each alignment hole and turn loosely to catch the insert, tilting the platform back and forth or lifting up as necessary. Once both screws catch the thread, securely tighten them.



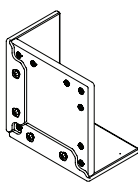
7 Now that both panels are connected to the platform, tilt the module so that it's sitting upright, with the platform on the floor and the panels standing up straight. Grab a corner brace and two slot screws. Locate the two smaller threaded inserts near the inside top corner of each panel.



8 Use the slot screws to lock the corner brace in place. We recommend loosely catching the thread on each side to get the alignment right, rather than fully tightening one before the other. Use a flathead screwdriver or a quarter to help tighten the slot screws.

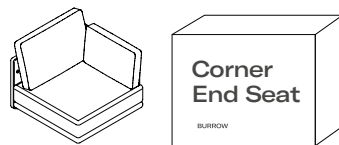


9 Tilt the partially-assembled Corner Seat module so one of the back panels is on the floor again, place it in its approximate final position, and set aside any pieces you didn't use for later, when you connect this module to the others.
















Corner End Seat

This box contains a closed-end seat, with both a wider back panel and a narrow arm panel. The back panel is the full width of the seat, while the arm panel is slightly narrower. You can tell the two panels apart by the alignment holes on the tabs: the backs have two holes, and the arms have four. The steps change a little bit depending on whether or not the module is in the left or right position, but you'll most likely need one of each. When in doubt, consult your configuration map.

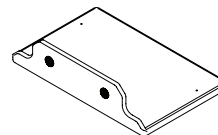


Tip: This box contains a straight brace, some extra slot screws, and a button screw, but you won't need them until you connect this module to another. Set them safely aside.

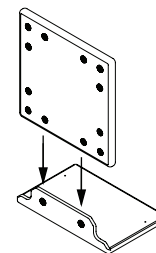
Corner End Seat, Left

Not sure what this means? Grab your configuration map and match this module to the layout. If it's on the left side of your layout, follow these steps. If it's on the right, skip ahead a page. Your configuration will likely have Corner End Seat modules on both the left and right, in which case you'll set up one of each.

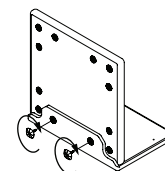
- 1 Lay the back panel flat on its back, so the tab is perpendicular to the floor.



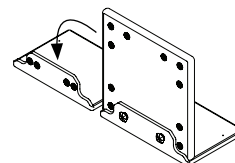
- 2 Lower the platform so that it's nested inside the tab. Line up the left and right edges of the platform and the panel so that they're flush with each other.



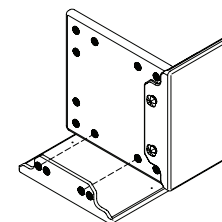
- 3 Push a hand screw through each of the alignment holes, and loosely turn to catch the threaded insert. You may have to tilt the platform back and forth, or lift it up slightly, in order to get the hand screw to catch the thread. We recommend loosely attaching both hand screws to get the alignment right, rather than fully tightening one before the other. Once you can feel that they've caught the thread, securely tighten both hand screws.



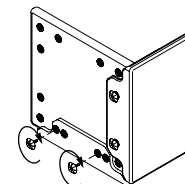
- 4 Lay the arm panel on its back to the left of the in-progress module, with the tab perpendicular to the floor. Tilt the in-progress module so the platform is nested inside the arm panel tab (the back panel, already attached, will be in the air).



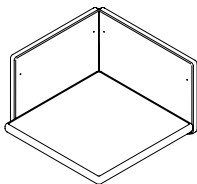
- 5 Line up the right edge of the arm panel and the left edge of the back panel so that they're flush. The tab on the arm panel has two pairs of alignment holes; when the two panels are flush, the left-most holes of each pair will line up with the correct threaded inserts in the platform.



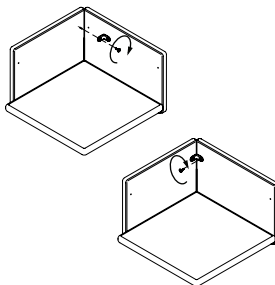
- 6 Just like you did in step 3, push a hand screw through each alignment hole and turn loosely to catch the insert, tilting the platform back and forth or lifting up as necessary. Once both screws catch the thread, securely tighten them.



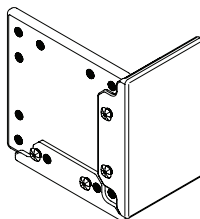
7 Now that both panels are connected to the platform, tilt the module so that it's sitting upright, with the platform on the floor and the panels standing up straight. Grab a corner brace and two slot screws. Locate the two smaller threaded inserts near the inside top corner of each panel.



8 Use the slot screws to lock the corner brace in place. We recommend loosely catching the thread on each side to get the alignment right, rather than fully tightening one before the other. Use a flathead screwdriver or a quarter to help tighten the slot screws.



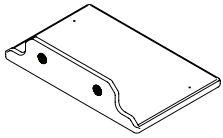

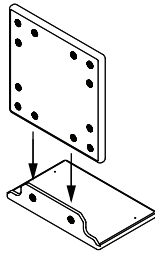
Corner End Seat, Right

Not sure what this means? Grab your configuration map and match this module to the layout. If it's on the right side of your layout, follow these steps. If it's on the left, flip back a page. Your configuration will likely have Corner End Seat modules on both the left and right, in which case you'll set up one of each.

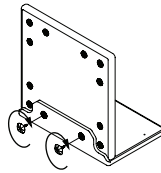
- 1 Lay the back panel flat on its back, so the tab is perpendicular to the floor.



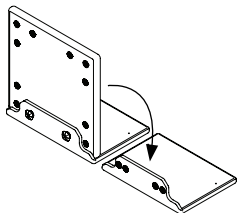
- 2 Lower the platform so that it's nested inside the tab. Line up the left and right edges of the platform and the panel so that they're flush with each other.



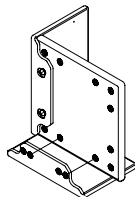
- 3 Push a hand screw through each of the alignment holes, and loosely turn to catch the threaded insert. You may have to tilt the platform back and forth, or lift it up slightly, in order to get the hand screw to catch the thread. 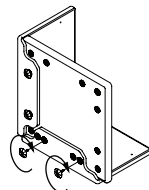

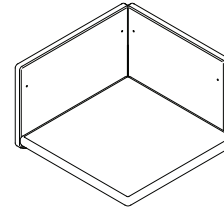
- 5 Line up the left edge of the arm panel and the right edge of the back panel so that they're flush. The tab on the arm panel has two pairs of alignment holes; when the two panels are flush, the right-most holes of each pair will line up with the correct threaded inserts in the platform.



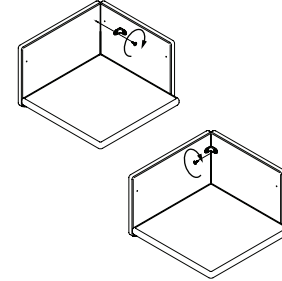
- 6 Just like you did in step 3, push a hand screw through each alignment hole and turn loosely to catch the insert, tilting the platform back and forth or lifting up as necessary. Once both screws catch the thread, securely tighten them.



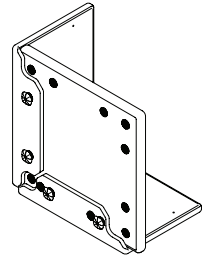
- 7 Now that both panels are connected to the platform, tilt the module so that it's sitting upright, with the platform on the floor and the panels standing up straight. Grab a corner brace and two slot screws. Locate the two smaller threaded inserts near the inside top corner of each panel.

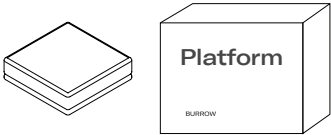

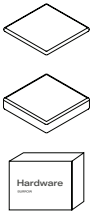
Platform

This box contains the universal building block of the Field system: a square ottoman that can attach to the side of any other seat in the system, as a chaise or a lounge extension. It also happens to be very easy to assemble.

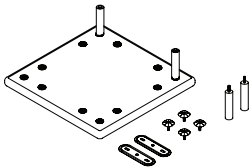
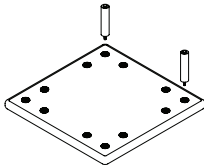
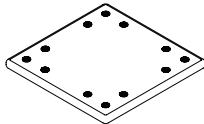

Instructions for a connected Platform

Not sure what this means? Grab your configuration map and match this module to the layout. If your configuration has an attached, armless seat on either end, or in a chaise-like arrangement, follow these steps. If it's a freestanding ottoman, skip ahead.

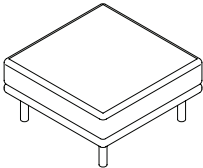
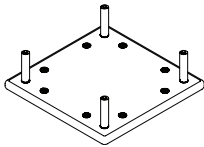
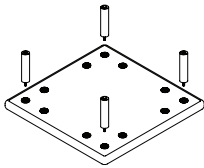
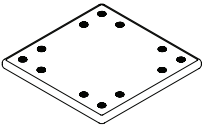
- 1 Lay the platform upside down on the floor.
- 2 Screw two legs (found in your Hardware Box) into the threaded inserts at the corners of one side of the platform, as shown.
- 3 Put the partially-assembled module in its approximate final position, and set aside the cushion and any other pieces you didn't use for later.



Instructions for a freestanding Platform

Not sure what this means? If your configuration includes a floating, disconnected ottoman, follow these steps. You can always attach your ottoman later, in a chaise-like arrangement. Follow the steps for an "attached Platform" for that.

- 1 Lay the platform upside down on the floor.
- 2 Screw four legs (found in your Hardware Box) into each of the threaded inserts at the four corners of the platform, as shown.
- 3 Flip the platform upright and place the cushion on top, and place it in the room. You'll have a few extra pieces; hold on to these in case you ever decide to attach your ottoman to the rest of your Field configuration.





Part IV

Setting up your Field

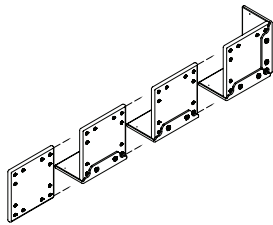
Connecting your modules

You're on the home stretch now

You should have a set of partially-assembled modules, all in their approximate final position in your room — and a bunch of extra connection plates, legs, and other hardware. Now, you'll connect each module to build your final Field configuration. This is where the configuration map is really important, so make sure you have that handy.

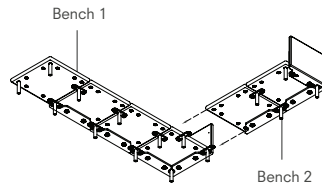
Have an armchair? Go ahead and attach the extra arm now, according to your configuration map, using two hand screws. Then, attach a leg in each of the four corners, and use the button screws to fill the open inserts on either side. You can skip ahead to page 32, to place and perfect your cushions.

- 1 All of your modules, except Ottomans, should be lying on their backs. Line them up in their approximate final position — like your sofa or sectional got tipped over.



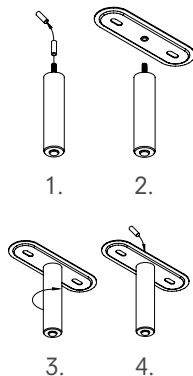
- 2 If you have a sofa configuration with your seats in a straight line, or anything with an attached Ottoman in a chaise-like position, you should have one long 'bench' section. Push the modules together so that they're flush. If you have a sectional configuration — basically, any layout that has a right angle when you look at your configuration map — separate the modules into separate 'bench' sections. For example, one

'bench' might have a right Corner End Seat and an Inline Seat; and another 'bench' could have two Inline Seats, a Corner Seat, and an Ottoman. You'll connect the modules to build each bench separately, and connect them at the very end.

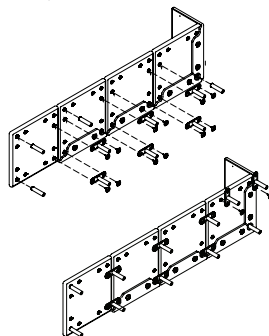


- 3 Take a close look at your configuration map. Count out how many leg & connection plate assemblies you'll need (rule of thumb: two for each gap between modules) and how many additional legs you'll need (one at every corner of your configuration).

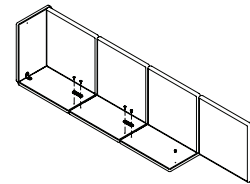
- 4 Put together as many leg & connection plate assemblies as you need by removing the plastic cap from the leg, screwing it into the middle of the convex side of the plate, and replacing the plastic cap on the other side.



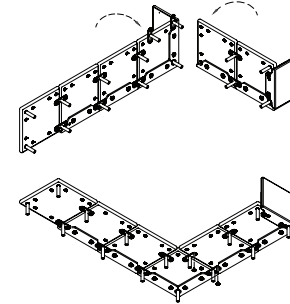
- 5 Use the hand screws inserted through the eye holes on each leg & plate assembly to connect the bottom of each module, carefully following your configuration map as a guide. If you have a sectional, figure out where the benches will connect, and attach the leg & plate assemblies so they're hanging off the edge where the two benches meet. After you flip the bench sections upright, the end that doesn't have legs will rest on those two plates.



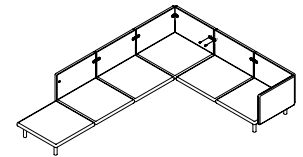
- 6 Gather the flat braces, slot screws, and button screws that you didn't use before. Use the flat braces and slot screws to connect any back and arm panels, while they're still resting on the ground. The concave side of the braces will face in. Use the button screws to fill any open inserts on the ends of your sofa or sectional.



- 7 With a partner, flip everything upright. If you have a sectional configuration, rest the edge of the module that doesn't have legs on top of the leg & plate assemblies protruding from the other bench. Reach underneath and securely connect it with hand screws.



- 8 If you have a sectional configuration, once the bench sections are upright and connected underneath, you'll need a final flat brace (or two) to connect the panels. Use two more slot screws and remember that the concave side of the brace faces in. Then, you're ready to place your cushions.



Placing and perfecting your cushions

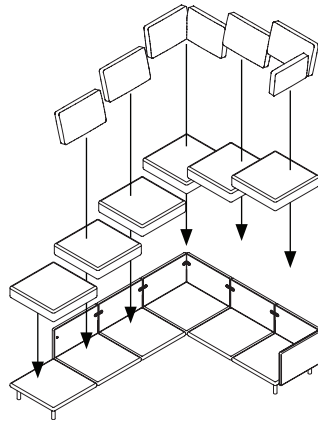
At this point, you should have the frame of your Field configuration nestled in the exact spot in your room where it'll live — and a big pile of cushions off to the side. All that's left is to put the soft parts of your sofa or sectional in their place. You're so close!

Stuffing and placing your cushions

1 Each seat cushion is a perfect square, so they can go on any of the seat platforms. Our only tip is to make sure the zipper side isn't facing out.

2 There are three sizes of cushion inserts and covers: back, arm, and corner. Carefully take each insert out of the vacuum-sealed packaging, and stuff each insert into the corresponding cover. Tip: Fluff the inserts before you stuff them in the covers!

3 The back cushions go against the back panels. The arm cushions go against the arm panels. And that corner cushion, if you have one? It pairs with a back cushion to make a nice, neat inner corner.

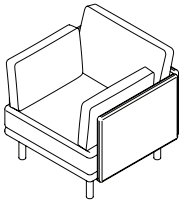
