Controlling Playback

To adjust playback for your connected HDMI, or AV device, use the controls on your device or the remote control for that device.

Controlling Playback (USB)

Use the following buttons on the remote control to adjust playback while playing media from a USB device:


After entering the correct mode, press the $\blacktriangle \blacktriangleright \blacktriangledown \blacktriangleleft$ navigation buttons to select "C" then press the [OK] button.

Next, use the $\blacktriangle \blacktriangleright \blacktriangledown \blacktriangleleft$ navigation buttons again to select the correct file to preview, then hit the [OK] button to play.



When using the projector remote control, make sure that you are aiming at the IR receiver on the back of the projector

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Connecting HDMI Devices

1. If the projector is ON, power it OFF.
2. Insert one of the connectors of an HDMI cable (not included) into one of the HDMI inputs on the side of the projector. Insert the other connector into the HDMI output of your video-playing device.
3. Power the projector back ON, then press the [] button on the projector or the remote and select the correct HDMI input using the navigation buttons on the projector or remote control.

Connecting AV Devices

1. If the projector is ON, power it OFF.
2. Insert the single 3.5mm connector of an AV cable (not included) into the AV input on the side of the projector. Insert the RCA connectors into the inputs on your video-playing device, matching the colors where applicable.

AV cables are typically color-coded as:

- Yellow: Video channel
- White: Left audio channel
- Red: Right audio channel

3. Power the projector back ON, then press the [] button on the projector or the remote control and select the AV input using the navigation buttons on the projector or remote control.

Connecting USB Devices

1. If the projector is ON, power it OFF.
2. Insert the connector of your USB device, such as a USB flash drive loaded with files, into the USB input on the side of the projector.
3. Power the projector back ON, then press the [] button on the projector or the remote control and select "USB." From there, find the media you would like to play on the USB device.

NOTE: Power the projector OFF before removing a USB.

Connecting Microphone (Karaoke)

1. Insert the single 3.5mm connector of the microphone into Mic In Jack on the side of the projector.
2. Turn on the microphone.


INTRODUCTION

The following instruction manual will take you through the entire setup of the projector, including how to mount or place it, how to connect it to various media sources, and more.

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LOCATION OF CONTROLS - PROJECTOR





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POWERING THE PROJECTOR

Insert the pin of the supplied power adapter into the DC power input jack on the side of the projector. Plug the adapter into an electrical outlet.

When the adapter is plugged in, the LED indicator on the projector will briefly turn RED, then GREEN, then RED again.



Powering ON/OFF

- Press the [] button on the projector or the remote control to power the projector ON.
- Press the [] button on the projector or the remote control to power the projector OFF. A message will be displayed, and you must press the [] button again while the message is displayed to power OFF.



When you are ready to use the projector, remove the lens cap from the lens

CONNECTING DEVICES

The projector can be connected to a number of different video sources:

HDMI - Blu-ray players, streaming & cable boxes, gaming systems, computers
AV - DVD players, older video game systems
USB - USB memory sticks, portable hard drives, supports up to 32 GB


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Projector Adjustment

Once the projector is in place, it still may require finer tweaks for best picture.

- The focus knob can be used to adjust the focus/image quality. While adjusting focus, watch the pixels at the center of the image.
- If the projector is placed at an angle or is projecting at an angle, the keystone knob can be used to compensate for this. Keystone correction will alter the shape to a square or rectangle.
- To adjust the vertical angle that the projector is placed at, screw or unscrew the angle adjustment knob located on the underside of the projector:

After adjusting the angle of the projector may need to re-assess and adjust the focus and keystone of the image.





LOCATION OF CONTROLS - REMOTE CONTROL


- [] Button: Power ON/OFF
- [] Button: Mute/unmute volume
- [   ] Buttons: Navigate menu
- [] Button: Confirm selection
- [] Button: Open projector menu
- [] Button: Exit or return to last menu
- [] Button: Change media input mode
- [] & [] Buttons: Adjust volume

Battery Installation

The remote control requires two (2) AAA alkaline batteries to operate (not included).



- Follow the **polarity diagram** on the inside of the battery compartment.
- **Do not mix old and new batteries** or different brands or types of batteries (ie. alkaline and Ni-MH rechargeable batteries)



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SETTING UP THE PROJECTOR

The projector can be set up in a number of configurations. Correct placement, angle, and distance are of the utmost importance to get the most from the projector.


Before setting anything up, first determine if the area you are going to be using the projector is suitable:

- Is the location dark, or can it be made dark (you will also want one wall that receives NO direct light for the projector screen)?
- Does it have a flat surface for projection?
- Is there an area to place the projector or a ceiling mount to hang the projector?

If all the above criteria are met, then the location should be adequate.

Distance

Because the focus and size of the image can be adjusted using the focus knob, the distance the projector is placed will be important to pay attention to, but allows for some adjustment.



Use the focus knob to adjust image quality.

If the image is still blurry or out of focus, you may need to move the projector closer to or further away from the screen.



Projector Placement

The projector can be placed in a number of different configurations:


Front Table

The projector will be placed on a flat surface, such as a table, and project onto the screen in front of it.




Rear Table

The projector will be placed on a flat surface, such as a table, and project onto the screen from behind. A special projector screen may be required for this configuration (not included).




Front Ceiling

The projector will be suspended from a ceiling mount (not included) and project onto a screen in front of it. A ceiling mount is required for this configuration (not included).



Rear Ceiling

The projector will be suspended from a ceiling mount (not included) and project onto a screen from behind. A special projector screen and a ceiling mount may be required for this configuration (neither included).



Mounting the projector from the ceiling will require a projector mount and mounting equipment (not included). The mounting screw is located on the underside of the projector.

When the projector is upside down, the view must be flipped using the remote control.

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
