XBOX ONE X

Microsoft has marketed its newest hardware as the "world's most powerful console," but this new Xbox also outpaces many similarly-priced PCs. The guts of Microsoft's new machine are a 2.3GHz custom octacore processor and an AMD GPU with 12GB GDDR5 RAM and 6 teraflops of performance. All this horsepower allows the Xbox One X to run the entire Xbox One library with faster load times, improved anisotropic filtering, 4K output, and supersampling. Microsoft says even those who haven't upgraded to 4K displays will notice the difference. But bigger isn't always better, and Microsoft has packed all this tech into its smallest Xbox case to date — a sleek black box that is oddly reminiscent of Sony's PS2. Microsoft still needs to prove why Xbox One and Xbox One S owners should upgrade to this new hardware, but hopefully we'll hear more about how the system's upcoming software lineup will take full advantage of this powerful new hardware before its November 7 release.

LOGITECH POWERPLAY WIRELESS CHARGING MOUSE PAD

We haven't been excited for a mouse pad since the mid-'90s, but Logitech's new wireless charging system solves a universal wireless problem. Using electromagnetic resonance, this mouse pad wirelessly charges any of Logitech's newest line of wireless mice, including the G703 and G903 models. The system is designed to deliver enough juice to keep your mice fully powered even when in use. The Powerplay also has a built-in wireless receiver, which helps further cut down wireless lag and eliminates the need for an additional USB receiver. You can throw your extra rechargeable batteries away when the Powerplay releases later this fall.

RAZER THRESHER GAMING HEADSET

Razer's newest Thresher headset is so comfortable it practically melts onto your head. The headset's internal 50mm drivers pump directional, wireless Dolby 7.1 surround sound straight into your ears while two leatherette, memory-foam ear cups isolate you from outside noise. A pair of swappable cooling-gel infused ear cushions also help keep your ears sweat-free for hours. Even through the noise of the E3 floor, the Thresher's retractable digital microphone provided crystal clear voice communication. Razer has just released two versions of the headset, one for the PS4 and one for the Xbox One, but both versions are also compatible with PC.
